Consider recommendations regarding an Amendment to the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) Agreement between the Bunnies Urgently Needing Shelter (BUNS) License Agreements for a Housing and Quarantine Facility at the Animal Services Shelter (RP File No. 003825), Santa Barbara, Second District, as follows:

a) Approve and authorize the Chair to execute an Amendment to the MOU Agreement between the BUNS organization and Santa Barbara County that will allow the term to renew automatically on a month to month basis as well as annually, until given sixty (60) days written notice to terminate;
