Section 1: The above recitals are true and correct.

<u>Section 2:</u> The Board of Supervisors consents to the City of Santa Barbara forming the SBSCTBID, which District shall include the unincorporated area of the County of Santa Barbara as outlined in the district map.

<u>Section 3:</u> The Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is hereby directed to transmit a certified copy of this Resolution to the Clerk of the City of Santa Barbara City Council.

<u>Section 4:</u> This Resolution is effective upon its adoption.
