Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors consider the following recommendations:

- a) Approve, ratify, and execute a Fourth Amendment to the Fifth Emergency Memorandum of Agreement for Mutual Aid between the County of Santa Barbara and the 37th District Agricultural Association to extend the term for the use of the Santa Maria Fairpark located in Northern Santa Barbara County for use on a weekly basis to assist with emergency management services in connection with the COVID-19 INCIDENT, including but not limited to testing and vaccinations from April 1, 2022 through June 30, 2022 for an amount not to exceed \$100,000; and
- b) Determine that the recommended actions are not the acceptance and approval of a project that is subject to environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(b)(4), finding that the project is a creation of government funding mechanisms or other government fiscal activities, which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment; and that the actions are exempt from CEQA pursuant to Guidelines Section 15269(c) as they consist of specific actions necessary to prevent or mitigate an emergency.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda for your Board to approve, ratify, and execute a Fourth Amendment to the Emergency Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) for Mutual Aid with the 37th District Agricultural Association (Attachment A) to extend the term to continue providing community COVID-19 testing at the Santa Maria Fairpark as part of the County's COVID-19 response efforts for the period of April 1, 2022 through June 30, 2022.

Background:

On March 12, 2020, the Board of Supervisors declared a local emergency proclamation in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. As part of the County's response to stop the spread of the Coronavirus, the County used its emergency contract authority to execute the MOAs with the 37th District Agricultural Association to provide community COVID-19 testing. These MOAs for the period of May 4, 2020 through December 31, 2021 were executed pursuant to the Director of Emergency Services' authority under County Code Chapter 12 and ratified by the Board on November 2, 2021.

Your Board approved a Third Amendment to the MOA with the 37th District Agricultural Association for the provision of community COVID-19 testing on a weekly basis as part of the County's COVID-19 response and mitigation efforts for the extended period of January 1, 2022 through March 31, 2022.

This request is for your Board to approve, ratify, and execute the Fourth Amendment to the MOA with the 37th District Agricultural Association for the provision of community COVID-19 testing on a weekly basis as part of the County's COVID-19 response and mitigation efforts for the extended period of April 1, 2022 through June 30, 2022.

Performance Measure:

There are no performance measures for the use of the Santa Maria Fairpark facility.

Contract Renewals and Performance Outcomes:

Santa Maria Fairpark has been an outstanding facility for community COVID-19 testing and vaccine distribution.

Fiscal Analysis:

Based on incurred rental usage and services, it is anticipated that the Public Health Department may expend up to \$100,000 as a not to exceed, during April 1, 2022 through June 30, 2022 on providing facility use for testing and vaccinations at this site. Costs associated with these MOAs will be funded through federal funds received from the Federal Epidemiology and Laboratory Capacity Enhancing Detection Expansion funding from the Federal Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act of 2021, P.L. 116-260.

Key Contract Risks
