I am the Director of Friends of Woni (which means "vision" in Swahili) Kenya International, a non-profit that provides safe water & supports education in underserved communities that receive little to no support from the governments in Sub-Saharan Africa. During Covid, we have provided bi-annual food shipments to our Maasai friends; the lack of tourists means no income for them.

Our non-profit has been embraced by the Latino community. I met Jackie Abbud about four or five years ago. She has been a supporter of our non-profit and is one of several in the Santa Ynez Valley who have hosted us at their ranch for fundraising events with barbeque, dancers, & horses. Jackie hosted us at her home on 7/27/2019 from 1pm – 8pm. On one occasion our attendance at an event was lower than anticipated and Jackie did not hesitate to write a check to cover our expenses.

While I am aware that there is a problem between Jackie & her neighbor regarding a Homestay Permit, I hope that you will not hold Jackie's generosity against her when considering her permit. Without people like her, we simply cannot fulfill our mission to provide solar panels & pumps, a water reservoir, water wells, & other basics to make life & education better for the Maasai people. One of our past projects built a dormitory so that the girls could attend the one area school. Without a dormitory, it is impossible to walk the number of miles that would be required daily to get to school.

As you likely know, Santa Barbara has more non-profits per capita than any County in California which makes fundraising a competitive task.

I have always found Jackie to be a pleasant & caring person & I hope that she can obtain her Home Stay permit.
