Dear County Board of Supervisors,

My name is Alan Brumberger and I live in Montecito. I am a member of the Board of the Santa Barbara Library Foundation. I am writing to express my support for the Santa Barbara Public Library and to urge you to fully fund our Library.

The Santa Barbara Public Library provides our entire county not only books and on-line educational resources but also a breadth of critical public services NOT provided by any other agency in Santa Barbara. These services include, but are not limited to, Early and Adult Literacy programs to employment assistance and Veterans' resources. (For a more inclusive listing of these services please see exhibit 1). In addition, the Library provides numerous outreach public services shown on Exhibit 2.

The County's funding of the Library is critical. While the City of Santa Barbara provides significant funding to the Library, the net amount, after deducting allocated costs, does not even cover the salary and benefit costs. The table below shows some of the metrics which define the need in the City:

The Santa Barbara Public Library serves 68,000 Zone 1 cardholders with per capita based upon an estimated population of 99,000. The Goleta Public Library serves only 22,000 Zone 4 cardholders with per capita funding based upon an estimated population of 92,000. The Santa Barbara Public Library receives \$800,000 to serve 68,000 cardholders in Zone 1 and Goleta Public Library receives \$700,000 to serve 22,000 cardholders in Zone 4. The inequity is obvious with Zone 1 receiving less funds to serve more users.

In conclusion, The Santa Barbara Public Library shoulders the burden for a number of important public services unmet by any other Agency but does not receive the financial support necessary to meet this burden. As the result of the forgoing, I believe the Library's allocation should be increased, but I am urging you to at least protect these vital county services by fully funding the Santa Barbara Public Library's budget and not reducing it.
