Recommended Actions:

- a) Approve, ratify, and authorize the Chair to execute Amendment No. 1 to the Agreement for Professional Legal Services with Strumwasser & Woocher LLP for independent legal counsel to the County of Santa Barbara Citizens' Independent Redistricting Commission, increasing the not-to-exceed amount to \$255,400 and extending the term to June 30, 2022; and
- b) Determine that the above actions are not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15378(b)(5) of the CEQA Guidelines, because they consist of administrative activities of government that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment.

Summary Text:

This amendment adds \$55,400 to the agreement to cover litigation costs incurred to defend the Citizens' Independent Redistricting Commission (Commission), and extends the contract to June 30, 2022.

Background:

On March 9, 2021, the County entered into an agreement with Strumwasser & Woocher LLP to provide independent outside legal counsel for the Commission. The agreement was for an amount not-to-exceed \$200,000. The agreement also provided that if litigation is initiated against the Commission, the firm and the County shall meet and negotiate in good faith as to whether the firm's services in representing the Commission in such litigation should reasonably be subsumed within the not-to-exceed amount, or whether an amendment to the agreement is necessary and appropriate to authorize additional funds to

pay for such litigation services. Litigation was initiated against the Commission. Based on the significant amount of work related to the litigation, staff believes that an amendment to the agreement is necessary and appropriate to authorize additional funds to pay for such litigation services.

The term of the initial contract was until April 30, 2022. This amendment would extend the contract term to June 30, 2022, primarily to allow time for the Commission to have independent legal counsel at an "after action" meeting.
