FFPSA PART I STATUTE (AB 153)

FFPSA PART I PREVENTION SERVICES

Signed into law February 9, 2018 with a goal to enhance public child welfare agencies, while creating new opportunities to receive federal funding for the provision of prevention services to children at imminent risk of entering foster care

- First open-ended entitlement program for prevention services.
- Most substantial funding reform in the child welfare arena in the last 20 years.
- Challenges states to explore ways to reform the entire continuum of the child welfare system.

Title IV-E Reimbursement for Limited-Time, Approved Prevention Services

- Mental Health
- Substance Use Disorder
- In-Home Parenting Skills

Candidates for Prevention Services

• Imminent risk of entry or re-entry into foster care

- Creation and Submission of State Five-Year Prevention Plan






Child Abuse And Neglect Referrals




Entries into Out of Home Care

CALIFORNIA'S FIVE YEAR FFPSA IMPLEMENTATION PLAN

FFPSA PART I PREVENTION SERVICES

California has submitted a five-year implementation plan to Administration for Children and Families detailing the state's prevention strategy. The Plan outlines the following:

- Candidacy/eligibility for services
- Equity, Inclusion, and Disproportionality
- Pathways to Prevention Services
- Delivery of trauma-informed evidence-based services
- Continuous Quality Improvement
- Outcome assessment evaluation
- Workforce Training and Development

DETERMINING ELIGIBILITY FOR SERVICES

Candidates for Foster Care

- Includes children in open CWS family maintenance cases.
- Targeted populations at risk of entry.

Pregnant and
Parenting Youth in
Foster Care

- Automatically eligible
- Includes fathers
- Services are voluntary.

Family Members of Candidates

 Eligible upon determination of child(ren) being identified as candidates

EQUITY INCLUSION & DISPROPORTIONALITY

Focus on addressing disproportionality among BIPOC, Native American, and LGBTQ+ children and youth

Adapt to the Integrated Core Practice Model to ensure authentic engagement and partnership

Ensure a Trauma-Informed Approach and incorporate cultural adaptations to eligible Evidence-Based Programs

Include Community Pathway to provide access to services prior to the creation of a referral

PATHWAYS TO PREVENTION SERVICES

Initial Assessment

CBO/FRC conducts an assessment of family's strengths/needs

Title IV-E Agency

Community

 Identify family who would benefit from prevention services through hotline, family maintenance (FM) Candidacy Determination (utilizing an imminent risk tool)

CBO/FRC Provides
 Recommendation to
 Title IV-E Agency so they
 can make a candidacy
 determination

 Title IV-E Agency determines candidacy.

Prevention Planning and Teaming

- CBO/FRC develops prevention plan, completes case management, and monitors safety and risk
- Services may be offered under FM services or via contracted agency

DELIVERY OF TRAUMA-INFORMED EVIDENCE-BASED SERVICES

Evidence Based Programs as Prevention Services

- Well-supported, supported, and/or promising in Prevention Services Clearinghouse
- Delivered by a qualified clinician
- California Plan includes 10 currently approved programs

CONTINUOUS QUALITY IMPROVEMENT, EVALUATION & WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT

Continuous Quality Improvement

 Continuously monitor the implementation and services to ensure fidelity to the model, determine outcomes achieved, and determine how information learned from monitoring will be used to refine and improve practices.

- Promoting Prevention

LOCAL IMPLEMENTATION & NEXT STEPS

Receive Final federal & State Guidance:

- Comprehensive Prevention plan approval and Opt in process
- Funding Resources and Allocations
- Reporting Requirements

Leverage Existing Workgroups and Meetings to:

- Solicit Stakeholder and Community input
- Align and submit Prevention Plan with Child and Family Services Review Process
- Partner with CBO's for capacity building, training, and certification of Evidence Based Prevention Services

Continue Implementation Planning:

- Workforce Development and Training
- Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI), Outcomes and Model Fidelity Oversight
- Data Collection,
 Documentation and Reporting
- Automation for Prevention Services Delivery and Claiming
