SUBJECT: Fiscal Year (FY) 2022-2023 Agreements for Adult Probation Program Services

Recommended Actions: That the Board of Supervisors:

- A. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Good Samaritan Shelter (Good Sam) (a local vendor) to provide drug and alcohol treatment, Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC), pretrial services navigators, clean and sober housing, and residential withdrawal management with a total contract amount not to exceed \$967,665 from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023;
- B. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Community Solutions Incorporated (CSI) (a local vendor) to provide Batterer's Intervention Program (BIP), CBT, and reentry support services in Santa Maria and Santa Barbara, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$527,948 from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023;
- C. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Council on Alcoholism and Drug Abuse (CADA) (a local vendor) to provide drug and alcohol services, CBT, and Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC) services, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$176,786.24 from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023;

- D. Approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Sanctuary Centers of Santa Barbara (Sanctuary) (a local vendor) to provide enhanced outpatient treatment services and related recovery and re-entry services for a dual diagnosis population, with a total contract amount not to exceed \$30,000 from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023;
- E. Aprove and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with SCRAM of California (a local vendor) to provide Secure Continuous Remote Alcohol Monitoring (SCRAM) services that includes equipment, the installation and removal of equipment, service monitoring, and support for adult clients, who are under supervision by the Probation Department, including pre-trial defendants released to the Pre-Trial Supervision program with a total contract amount not to exceed \$471,610 from July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023;
- F. Authorize the Chief Probation Officer or designee to approve subsequent line-item budget changes to Attachment B-1 of each Agreement in an amount not to exceed 10% of the stated line-item budgeted amounts for each service, as long as the total contract amount of each Agreement is not increased, and as long as the total budgeted amounts by each funding source are not exceeded;
- G. Determine that the above actions are government fiscal activities of funding mechanisms which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment, and are therefore not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15378(b)(4) of the CEQA guidelines.

Summary Text:

The California Community Corrections Act of 2009 (Senate Bill 678 [SB678]), and 2011 Public Safety Realignment Act (Assembly Bill 109 [AB109]), also known as Realignment, assist in funding services for the adult supervised population, the realigned population, and pretrial services. Services include cognitive behavioral treatment (CBT), drug and alcohol treatment services, residential withdrawal management, employment development skills, subsidized employment, clean and sober housing, inpatient residential alcohol and drug treatment remote alcohol monitoring, enhanced outpatient treatment services and related recovery and re-entry services for a dual diagnosis population. The services for the adult supervised population recommended in these Agreements and related expenditures were endorsed by the Executive Committee of the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) and included in the County's FY 2022-2023 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan which was approved by the Board of Supervisors on May 3, 2022. There are no proposed changes to the SB678 strategies at this time. Associated services and outcomes were reviewed by the CCP on April 1, 2022.

Background:

SB678 provides funding to probation departments based on achieved reductions in the failure rate of adult felony probationers. The State defines a failure as an adult probationer who was sent to state prison for a revocation of probation, as well as adult felony probationers sent to state prison for a conviction of a new felony offense. The CCP reviews local SB678 services and outcomes each year.

Realignment transferred responsibility for specified lower level inmates and parolees from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) to counties. This change was implemented on October 1, 2011. The CCP in each county is required to develop a Public Safety Realignment Act Plan for the subject population. Santa Barbara County's FY 2022-2023 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan, as developed by the CCP and endorsed by the Executive Committee of the CCP, was approved by the Board of Supervisors on May 3, 2022. The services for the realigned population and pretrial clients recommended in these Agreements and related expenditures were included in the County's FY 2022-2023 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan.

Execution of the Good Sam Agreement will provide evidence-based services to adult felony probationers and Realigned offenders. Good Sam will provide evidence-based drug and alcohol group services, Recovery Oriented System of Care (ROSC) group services, pretrial services navigators, clean and sober housing, and residential withdrawal management beds.

Execution of the CSI Agreement will provide services to adult felony probationers and Realigned offenders. Specifically, CSI will provide Batterer's Intervention Program (BIP), Cognitive Behavorial treatment (CBT), and reentry support services in Santa Maria and Santa Barbara.

Execution of the CADA Agreement will provide services to adult felony probationers and Realigned offenders. Specifically, CADA will provide evidence-based drug and alcohol group services, CBT, ROSC group services, residential drug and alcohol treatment.

Execution of the Sanctuary Agreement will provide services to adult felony probationers and Realigned offenders. Specifically, Sanctuary will provide enhanced outpatient treatment services and related recovery and re-entry services for a dual diagnosis population.

Execution of the SCRAM of California Agreement will provide services for adult clients, including those on pretrial supervision. Specifically, SCRAM of California will provide Secure Continuous Remote Alcohol Monitoring (SCRAM) services that includes equipment, installation and removal of equipment, monitoring, and support for adult clients.

All Agreements contain performance measures that are based on evidence-based principals and target efforts to reduce recidivism.

Narrative:

The attached five (5) Agreements for Adult Probation program services for FY 2022-23 are funded by State funding sources, which include Realignment revenue in an amount of \$1,755,311.72 and SB678 revenue in an amount of \$225,732.52 as well as General Fund monies in an amount of \$192,965 for a combined total funding of \$2,174,009.24. Funds for these Agreements have been accounted for in the FY 2022-23 proposed budget and future year's portion of the Agreements will be included through the proposed budget. Execution of the five (5) Agreements will not increase the General Fund Contribution to the Probation Department.

The attached five (5) Agreements are Board Contract renewals. Some modifications to the services and data collection expectations have been incorporated into the Agreements to ensure they are consistent with the approved FY 2022-23 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan.
