My name is Geoffrey Wheeler and I live and work and walk and ride my bike in Santa Maria.

I am writing to urge your support for the development of a public use levee trail extension from Santa Maria to Guadalupe.

This is public land which could be used for public benefit. It does not seem fair that farmers threaten residents with loss of jobs. Most people here are good and reasonable; they won't be climbing fences to enter farmer's fields. As winds prevail from the west, the farmers already need to be careful that any pesticides they use do not blow across Blosser Road. Hopefully they can move toward organic farmer which will be of benefit to surrounding residents, to farm workers and to consumers. Let's use public land for public benefit.

A trail would provide a safe and peaceful route to ride to Guadalupe. I've ridden there on my bicycle on 166. There is a wide shoulder but it is thick with dirt in some places from the farm vehicles entering and exiting fields.

Santa Maria needs more open space as there is a disproportionate investment in open space across our county. Residents in Santa Maria only have access to eight miles of trails over two options, while Santa Barbara residents can access over 130 miles of trails and 52 options. Sadly, only 17% of county open space located in the Santa Maria valley.

47% of Santa Maria residents live in areas with less than 3 acres of parks or open space per 1,000 residents. This project would double the miles of access to trails in Santa Maria.

There is fear that trail use on the proposed SM Levee Trail extension is incompatible with farming and will cause catastrophic economic harm to adjacent property. The reality on the ground in and around Santa Maria shows that to be completely wrong. Farms and trail use can co-exist and the levee trail can provide much needed recreation opportunities, away from dangerous vehicle traffic. A properly designed and monitored trail would cause no more harm than any of the current streets, bike lanes, pathways and sidewalks that are next to existing farms in our community.

Environmental justice: Extending the riverbed trail is an environmental justice issue.

- Equitable access to public green spaces is a critical component of environmental justice.
- Santa Maria is home to majority BIPOC working class families (with many folks being immigrants, indigenous, and farmworkers)
- Approximately 42% of the City of Santa Maria is considered a disadvantaged community through the CalEnviroscreen 4.0
- CalEnviroscreen 4.0 is a mapping tool used to help identify communities that are disproportionately burdened by pollution and where people are most vulnerable to its effects using environmental, health, and socioeconomic information
- The health and well-being of the most vulnerable populations in our county depend on access to safe and free spaces to move around with loved ones.
- The Nature Gap: People of color are more likely than white people to live in an area that is nature deprived across the united states (Source)
- Communities of color are three times more likely than white communities to live in nature deprived places.
- Seventy-four percent of communities of color in the contiguous United States live in nature-deprived areas, compared with just 23 percent of white communities.
- Seventy percent of low-income communities across the country live in nature-deprived areas.
- This figure is 20 percent higher than the figure for those with moderate or high incomes.
- In light of the climate crisis, the SM River Trail is a necessary climate-mitigation strategy.
- Research shows that green space can reduce city temperatures by as much as 10 degrees
 Fahrenheit. Poor communities are at the highest risk of climate impacts.
- Increasing access to green space gives community members a place to take care of their health physically and mentally (see health points)
- Health: Doubling the miles of trail space in Santa Maria will promote the health of community members
- Increasing green spaces in Santa Maria will be a large, undisputable benefit for mental and physical health
- o Numerous studies show clear correlations between exposure to nature and improved happiness, well-being, stress levels, and depression cases. (Source)
- Children show dramatic improvements in physical and mental health, cognitive development, social skills, and academic performance when given ample exposure to nature. (Source)
- Santa Maria and Guadalupe have really young populations in comparison to the state average
- The estimated median age of Santa Maria's residents is 28.7 whereas Guadalupe is 28.5, much lower than the median age of California residents (37.0) and that of the United States (38.1).

Hello Supervisors,

My name is Lourdes Bautista. I am a senior at Pioneer Valley High School. I fully believe it the expansion of the Riverbed Trail would be beneficial not just to the environment but for the well-being of Santa Maria as well. Through the CanEnviroscreen 4.0, Santa Maria is burdened by pollution at 42%as well slowly having a higher risk in climate because low income populations have a higher risk of being impacted by climate change. Scientific studies have revealed than an increase in greenery can reduce the city's temperature by at least 10 degrees Fahrenheit. If the Riverbed trail project is approved, it would also improve the distance for trail miles. Santa Maria currently possesses two options for 8 miles of trail, whereas Santa Barbara has over 10 times the amount of miles of trail. With the Riverbed trail expanding, citizens would also be able to have more ground to continue their health exercise or have somewhere to walk around. Please consider approving the project. 


