Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve plans and specifications for the construction of the Tajiguas Sanitary Landfill Main Access Road Extension & Site Improvements Fiscal Year 202-23, County Project No. 828395; Third Supervisorial District, on file in the Public Works Department office;
- b) Award, approve, and authorize the Chair to execute the construction contract in the amount of \$663,055.00 to the lowest responsible bidder, John Madonna Construction Co., Inc., P.O. Box 5310, San Luis Obispo, California 93403, subject to the provision of documents and certifications, as set forth in the plans and specifications applicable to the project, as required under California Law;
- c) Authorize the Public Works Director or designee to approve as change orders for a contingency amount up to \$66,305.50, for a total not to exceed authorization of \$729,360.50; and
- d) Determine that pursuant to California Environmental Quality Act Guidelines Section 15162, no substantial changes are proposed or have occurred, and no new information of substantial importance has come to light regarding environmental effects of the Tajiguas Sanitary Landfill Main Access Road Extension and Site Improvements Fiscal Year 2022-23 Project, or of the sufficiency or feasibility of mitigation measures. Therefore, the construction of the project is within the scope of the project covered by the Tajiguas Landfill Expansion Project EIR (01-EIR-05) certified by the Board of Supervisors on August 13, 2002, the Addendum to 01-EIR-05 dated November 8, 2006 and

accepted by the Board of Supervisors on December 5, 2006, and the Tajiguas Landfill Reconfiguration and Baron Ranch Restoration Project Subsequent EIR (08-EIR-00000-00007) (SCH No. 2008201052) certified by the Board of Supervisors on May 5, 2009, and that no new environmental document is required.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda in order to award the contract necessary for construction of the Tajiguas Sanitary Landfill Main Access Road Extension & Site Improvements Fiscal Year 2022/23 Project, County Project No. 828395.

On Thursday, May 19, 2022, five bids were opened for the referenced project. John Madonna Construction Co., Inc. submitted the lowest responsible bid in the amount of \$663,055.00 for base bid, and additive bid groups A, B, and C, excluding contingency.

This project was bid in accordance with the Public Contract Code, which requires the contract be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder. The Public Works Department analyzed the bids and determined the low bid is responsive and responsible. Analysis of the bids included confirmation by the low bidder of the correctness of the bid proposal information and review of the bids by the County Project Manager. Public Works staff recommends awarding this contract to John Madonna Construction Co., Inc.

Background:

The Tajiguas Sanitary Landfill Main Access Road Extension and Site Improvements Fiscal Year 2022-23 Project is part of the Tajiguas Landfill Expansion and Reconfiguration Project and is included in the Resource Recovery & Waste Management Division's Waste Discharge Requirements issued by the California Regional Water Quality Control Board on February 4, 2010 and the Revised Solid Waste Facility Permit as issued by CalRecycle on February 2, 2017. The authority to advertise for this project was approved by the Board of Supervisors on March 15, 2022.

On August 13, 2002, the BOS certified an Environmental Impact Report (EIR) (01-EIR-05) for, and approved, the Tajiguas Landfill Expansion Project (Front Canyon Expansion). An Addendum to 01-EIR-05 dated November 8, 2006 was accepted by the Board of Supervisors on December 5, 2006. In May 2009, the BOS certified a subsequent EIR (08EIR-00000-00007) for, and approved, the Tajiguas Landfill Reconfiguration and Baron Ranch Restoration Project (SCH No. 2008201052) (available for review at <https://www.countyofsb.org/1165/Environmental-Documents>). The proposed project includes the extension of paved access, a wet-weather turnaround and repaving portions of the main access road to the permitted waste disposal area analyzed as a part of the prior CEQA documents. No substantial changes are proposed or have occurred, and no new information of substantial importance has come to light regarding environmental effects of the project, or of the sufficiency or feasibility of mitigation measures. Therefore, pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15162, the Tajiguas Sanitary Landfill Main Access Road Extension and Site Improvements Fiscal Year 2022-23 Project, is within the scope of the prior environmental documents prepared for the Tajiguas Landfill and no new environmental document is required.
