

# 397 COVID-19 cases, five deaths reported

By KATHERINE ZEHNDER NEWS-PRESS STAFF WRITER

Santa Barbara County reported 397 new COVID-19 cases and five deaths Friday. Four individuals were in the 70-plus age group, and one was in the 30-49 age group. Two individuals had underlying health conditions, one death was associated with a congregate care facility.

Of the 397 cases, the highest number, 210, was in Santa Maria, according to the county Public Health Department. Neighboring Orcult had 28 cases.

Elsewhere, 49 cases were reported in

Elsewhere, 49 cases were reported in Lompoc and nearby Mission Hills and

Vandenberg Village.
Twenty-one cases were in Santa
Barbara and unincorporated Mission
Canyon.
Twenty-three cases were in the North
County areas that include Sisquoc, Casmalia,
Garey, Cuyama, New Cuyama and Guadalupe.
Twelve cases were in fall Vista.
Santa Ynez Valley reported four cases.
Seven cases were in Golda.
Ten cases were in the South County
corridor, which includes Montectio,
Summerland and Carpinteria.
The locations of 31 cases are pending.

Seventy patients are recovering in county hospitals. Another 13 are recovering in intensive care units.

Santa Barbara County now has a total of 83,760 cases, of which 1,077 are still infectious. The total number of dealth is 644.

The Santa Barbara County Public Health Department reported that 17.8% of the eligible 5-and-older population is fully vaccinated.

idea considering they represent a major portion of our tax base." Call'ax President Robert Gutierrez said in a statement. "If high earners leave – and they will, to avoid the tax hike as well as the headache of having to annually appraise everything they

own, anywhere in the world – the taxpayers left in California will be asked to pay more." he added. The California Federation

asked to pay more. 'he added. The California Federation of Teachers (CFT), which is sponsoring the bill, said this week that the tax would give the state the ability to fix several looming problems the state faces, including issues with wildfres, housely, education and water. "California billionaires have increased their wealth astronomically since the beginning of the pandemic, while regular working families have struggled to pay their bills," said CFT President Jeffrey Freilas said in a statement. He later added, "Its time we took care of each other, and not just watch billionaires fly into space." Assemblymember Lee's bill is similar to a proposal unveiled by

Assemblymember Lee's bill is similar to a proposal unveiled by Sen. Elizabeth Warren in March 2021 – the "Ultra-Millionaire Tax Act" – that sought to impose a 2% annual tax on households and trusts worth \$30 million to \$1 billion, and a 1½ surtax on households and trusts worth more than \$1 billion. If Assemblymember Lee's proposal is approved by the State Legislature, voters will decide on the measure on the 2022 ballot.
