#### **Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve, ratify and authorize the Chair to execute an agreement with the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) to receive reimbursement for the County's Detector Dog Team Program for the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 in the amount of \$264,219.13; and
- b) Determine that the above action involves government funding mechanisms and/or fiscal activities and is not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(4).

#### **Summary Text:**

Approval of this contract will enable the Department to be reimbursed for activities that support the Detector Dog Team. The source of the revenue is funding from the CDFA.

## **Background:**

The purpose for the Detector Dog Team is to enhance current department inspection and surveillance activities of plant products entering Santa Barbara County via parcel delivery facilities such as UPS, Federal Express, On Trac, and the US Postal Service. The one dog and one handler team work at the delivery facilities "sniffing" packages while they are sorted into delivery trucks. When the dog detects a package containing any plant material, he will alert the handler by pawing the package. It will then be set aside for inspection. If a pest is found, the package is quarantined and a sample sent to the state

laboratory for official identification. Packages containing prohibited pests that pose a threat to the economic or environmental well-being of the State are destroyed. The Board of Supervisors initially approved this program on July 21, 2015.
