Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors consider the following recommendations:

- A. Approve, ratify, and authorize the Chair to execute an Acceptance of Award No. 2242ADDF00 for the Tuberculosis (TB) Control Program with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH), TB Control Branch to assist in providing food, shelter, incentives and enablers (FSIE Award) for TB patients, patients suspected of having TB and/or contacts to TB patients. This award in the amount of \$38,100 is in addition to the previous award of \$6,499 that was accepted in August 2022, and is for the period of July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023.
- B. Approve Budget Revision Request BJE Number 0008684 to amend the Public Health Department's Fiscal Year 2022-23 Budget to add \$38,100 in new revenue and appropriation to be spent during the period of July 2022 through June 2023.
- C. Determine that these activities are not a project and are exempt from California Environmental Quality Act review per CEQA Guideline Section 15378(b)(4), since the recommended actions are government fiscal activities which do not involve commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

Summary Text: This item is on the agenda to accept additional funding for the existing FSIE Award for the Public Health Department's (PHD) TB Control Program for FY 22-23 (Attachment A). The CDPH TB Control Branch has awarded these funds to assist Santa Barbara County in treating and supporting individuals with active, and latent TB and expanding contact investigation efforts to prevent further spread of the disease.

Background:

Due to ongoing TB cases among children and adults with complex and resistant TB strains, clusters, and outbreaks, PHD has received additional funding from CDPH to support TB control and prevention efforts. TB control is a mandated core public health function involving both treatment of individuals with active TB and screening of individuals with contact to infectious cases to prevent the progression to active disease. The funds must be used in accordance with the State policies and procedures.

TB is a contagious disease that is transmitted through the air from one person to another by infectious airborne particles expelled when a person with tuberculosis coughs, sneezes or speaks. Anyone inhaling the air containing these particles may become infected.

For each TB case encountered, the PHD Disease Control and Prevention staff may investigate and screen up to 20 contacts per case in multi-family households. In congregate settings such as homeless shelters, where extensive exposure has occurred, contact counts are significantly higher.

Fiscal Analysis: Approving, authorizing and ratifying the Board Chair to execute an Acceptance of Award from the CDPH TB Control Branch for additional FSIE funding will provide an increase of \$38,100 of needed funding for the FSIE program through the end of Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

If our jurisdiction has an influx or outbreak of TB cases, additional FSIE funding can be requested. The original FSIE award in the amount of \$6,499 was approved by the Board through the Ongoing Grants List and accepted in August 2022. Accepting this additional award of \$38,100 will provide funding for FSIE expenses through the end of the fiscal year. Board approval and a budget revision are required because this additional FSIE award (\$38,100) adds more than 10% to the original TB Grant amount.
