Dear Supervisors,

I urge you to designate Rocky Nook Park a Santa Barbara County Historic Landmark.

The unique landscape is dotted with huge boulders from ancient debris flows. Chumash stories collected by JP Harrington tell of the great flood through the village of Xana'yan. Descendants of this ancient village live in Santa Barbara today.

The streamside ecology and Oak Woodland contribute to the health and aesthetics of our environment. The fresh water source was used for the founding of the Presidio in 1782 and the establishment of the Santa Barbara Mission in 1786. The Chumash built the reservoirs, grist mill, and miles of aqueducts that brought water by gravity from Mission Canyon to the city of Santa Barbara until modern times.

In 1881, George and Frances Dabney Oliver were one of the earliest settlers in Mission Canyon. They had retired from diplomatic service at the U. S. Consulate in the Azores where Mrs Oliver's family had served since being appointed by President Thomas Jefferson. A member of the Jose De la Guerra family was living in the cottage at the time.

The Oliver's loved Mission Canyon and their "Rocky Nook". They quietly contributed to the development of Santa Barbara. Everyone was welcome to picnics at their place. "Fanny," as she was called, was famous for her naturalistic garden. When George Oliver died she had the horse trough/fountain sculpted in his honor. It was placed at the far end of their property and was connected to the lower reservoir.

Mrs Oliver lived on until 1926. Her many friends and neighbors knowing she always wanted to leave "Rocky Nook" to the public, raised the funds to buy a portion of the estate for a Park. It became the first Santa Barbara County Park in South County. There is a deed restriction for park use only.

The historic cultural landscape was left as natural as possible.

In 1931, a caretakers cottage was built. Caretakers were descendants of Presidio soldiers. They were members of the community for 50 years.


In 1984, Parks Director and Landscape Architect, Mike Pahos, moved the Park offices into the cottage. He had it renovated for offices and added to the aesthetics of the entry with boulders and the distinctive Rocky Nook Park sign.


Stone retaining walls along the creek, curbs, and specimen trees are from the Oliver's time. Adobe foundation stones from the 1780's are on the cottage.

Ancient geologic structures and forms along with trails among native plants and trees have always been part of the scenery.

This natural educational experience greatly benefits the community and gives us a sense of place. Rocky Nook Park is an important County site worthy of the honor of Historic Landmark.

It's called, axtayuxash or islay, the place where the Chumash gathered to pick wild cherries.
