
Also, attached are nine (9) photos of some historic natural and man-made features in Rocky Nook Park that tell the history of Santa Barbara from ancient times to the present.






Local wood carver, Rica Coulter created the sign. The boulder entry with the County's official tree, the Santa Cruz Island Ironwood, (*Lyonothamnus floribundus*) was designed in 1972 by landscape architect Mike Pahos, County Parks Director for 22 years (1972-1994).



This old natural oak woodland ecology as experienced by the First Peoples and the Chumash is in an ancient debris flow boulder field, a character defining feature of Rocky Nook Park.



This deep, year round pool in the riparian habitat of this Rocky Nook Park section of Mission Creek is one of the few places where landlocked endangered Southern CA steelhead trout (Oncorhynchus mykiss) can still survive.



Hundreds of feet of finely handcrafted, unobtrusive, durable and functional historic sandstone retaining walls line Mission Creek's Creek, native CA Riparian habitat, and sections of the Park's driveway. Flowers are CA native Canyon sunflower (*Venegasia carpesioides*).



Spanish/Mexican Period stone foundation was saved and incorporated into the caretaker's cottage in 1932 and kept as part of the Co. Parks' Dept. Office addition/renovation in 1984. This is an important and unique historic feature.



This is one of two remnant stone barbecue pits left in Rocky Nook Park. These were made in the 1930s by the Works


Progress Administration (Depression Era WPA).



When Rocky Nook Park was created as a public park in 1928, as little of the landscape was removed as possible. Over the years driveways became asphalted while leaving special islands of Native CA oaks (Quercus agrifolia) and boulders. Pocket parking also contributes to the thoughtfully designed historic cultural landscape of this site.



Mission Canyon Road was laid out in 1876. Frances Dabney Oliver and her husband George S.J. Oliver purchased their little ranch from the Bishop of Monterey in 1881, which they named "Rocky Nook". The half-buried historic sandstone curbing defines the border between Rocky Nook Park and Mission Canyon Road. This historic curbing is along the entire front edge of Rocky Nook Park. The path, which is actually on Rocky Nook Park property works in a symbiotic relationship. It is a park path from the entry to the re-entry at the southwest corner bordering the Woman's Club and it is also a path for people going elsewhere. The Park's Deed Restriction has made this symbiosis a practical and ethically binding solution since 1928.



Solar flashing pedestrian activated crossing lights are, since December 2022, aiding pedestrians feel more comfortable crossing Mission Canyon Road between Rocky Nook Park and the Museum of Natural History.

REMEMBER: No vehicle is going faster than 20 to 25 MPH here. The brilliant road design prevents a faster speed.

Dear SBCOB -

Please make Rocky Nook Park a County Landmark.

I'm a Santa Barbara Native—and I don't know if that means anything. I also don't live in SB anymore, so I don't know if that means anything either, or if my native son status is negated by my absentee status. I'd love to come home, but, SB isn't affordable. But this isn't why I'm writing.

I am writing because I grew up in Mission Canyon. I walked or rode my bike to Roosevelt School, SBJH, and SBHS, and every single day from the time I was 8 or 9 years old I went through Rocky Nook Park. That's at least 275 days a year, sometime twice a day, times 10 years. (A conservative estimate would be that I've been in that park around 3000 times) The choice always was: which way to go? Do I go up to Mission Oaks Ln and walk behind the Fire Station? Or do I cut through to one of the long driveways and get back on Mission Canyon before getting home to Foothill Rd.

That park was my giant backyard, but not just my backyard, every kid from Laguna St to Tunnel Rd ran around in there. Climbing trees, climbing boulders, catching tadpoles, pretending to fish, etc. I can't speak for anyone else, but for me? That park was paradise between home and school. And on the weekends? I'd be off somewhere between the natural history museum and Botanic gardens, usually in the creek. I'd hiked every inch of mission creek from the museum to 7 falls by the time I was 12, and I knew every rock in Rocky Nook. And even now, at 53 years old and not having been down in the creek for 30 years, I bet I can still lead you to the Chumash mortar holes above the Mission Canyon bridge—assuming someone hasn't chilled them out as a souvenir. Those are the easy ones to find. But who here knows where the others are? ...walk the creek and you'll find out too.

There used to be a trail from SB Tennis Club that criss-crossed Mission Creek, hugging the hill under Mountain Dr that led down to Rocky Nook, and as kids, we'd hike that. I think one of my childhood cohort tried to take a bike on it once, and as I recall it didn't end well for the bike.

Roosevelt School would do field trips up the park for lunch a couple times a year, I don't know that they're allowed to do that anymore, but, in the 1970s it was ok.

Who would oppose landmarking a park? A park. I think a 95 year old park deserves to be preserved, and in my opinion, opposition to the landmark of a park equates to an agenda, and that agenda is almost always includes the freedom to develop something, maybe not now, but, eventually, because "God ain't makin' no more land", as they say.

But the fact is, Rocky Nook Park was given to the community by Frances Oliver. What a gift! Let's landmark the gift and keep it around so that your great grandchildren can find the mortars and marvel at (or climb) the giant boulders.
