- Identify criteria for each committee and ensure projects fit criteria
- Identify estimated cost for each project and screen for cost threshold

Community Project Funding Appropriations

Deadlines: March 3 (Padilla); March 13 (Feinstein); TBD (Carbajal)

- Limited to number of projects County can submit to each Senator/ Congressman
- Letter of support each request requires demonstrated community support
 - Letters of support from elected community leaders
 - Press articles highlighting the need for the specific project
 - Resolutions passed by local/county/state governments
 - Projects listed on community development plans, state intended use plans, and other publicly available planning documents
 - Support from local newspaper editorial boards, etc.

Approximate cost range per project: \$500,000 - \$2 M
