Alcohol and drug overdoses, bluff falls, assaults.



Infrastructure & Public Right of Ways



GOALS OF A REVISED OUTDOOR FESTIVAL ORDINANCE

- Extend the prohibition of certain activities during “Deltopia” weekend similar to Halloween.
- Provide the public with clear guidance on allowed and prohibited activities in residential zones.
- Protect residents and visitors from criminal prosecution.
- Discourage abuse of residential properties for profiteering activities.
- Discourage underage alcohol and drug distribution and use.
- Prevent overcrowding that leads to cliff and balcony falls and collapses.
- Provide a pathway for groups to hold legal events.

EXISTING LAWS PROHIBITING CONCERTS

1-7: Makes any offense of the codes a misdemeanor unless otherwise specific (\$500 fine and/or 6 months in jail).

6-30: Defines “entertainment.” Definition here includes a music performance.

6-31: Requires a “Class A” license for music performances.

6-48: Subjects intoxicated/under the influence of any drug cannot remain where an entertainment license exists.

6-70.01: Specifically gives dates and carves out violations occurring on those dates as an infraction. All other times of the year it’s a misdemeanor.

6-72: Requires a license for an outdoor festival. Violation is a misdemeanor.

6-91: Any festival requires enough parking to accommodate 1/5 of total attendance.

6-92: Security personnel required at all festivals (1 guard for every 200 people).

6-93: All fire codes and fire safety measures must be followed for outdoor festivals.

6-100: No intoxicated subjects allowed at outdoor festivals, no possession, consumption, or use of any alcohol/drugs on the premises of an outdoor festival.

22-9: Licenses cannot be issued for any activity that violates local, state or federal laws (specifically helpful with illegal alcohol sales).

22-10: Licenses cannot be issued where activity is prohibited by zoning laws.



EXISTING LAWS PROHIBITING FESTIVALS

Land Use & Development Code Article 2: Given the proximity to the ocean, a festival ordinance would require a Coastal Development Permit.

Land Use & Development Code 35.23.030: Concerts/musical performances are prohibited in residential zones.

Land Use & Development Code Coastal Zoning Plan: (beginning pg 58) Concerts/musical performances are not permitted in residential zones:

Section 35-71.3: Prohibited in Single Family Residential (R-1/E-1)

Section 35-72.3: Prohibited in Two Family Residential (R2)

Section 35-73.3: Prohibited in One Family Exclusive Residential (EX-1)

Section 35-74.4: Prohibited in Design Residential (DR)

Section 35-75.7: Prohibited in Planned Residential Development


Section 35-76.4: Prohibited in Medium Density Student Residential (SR-M)

Section 35-77.4: Prohibited in High Density Student Residential (SR-H)

Section 35-78.4: Allowed in Retail/General Commercial with Major Conditional Use Permit

Section 35-89.5: Allowed in Recreation District with Planning Commission Approval





FESTIVAL ORDINANCE CHANGES

- Extend the prohibition of certain activities during “Deltopia” weekend similar to Halloween.
- An “Outdoor Festival” would require a permit for over 250 attendees in Isla Vista (down from 500).
- Outdoor festivals over 250 attendees would be prohibited at all times on residential property in Isla Vista.
- Outdoor festivals or similar activities that require a ticket, purchase, or donation are prohibited at all times on residential property in Isla Vista.
- Outdoor festivals or similar activities that sell alcohol are prohibited at all times on residential property in Isla Vista.
- Penalties for hosting an outdoor festival or similar event where a ticket is required or alcohol can be purchased would be a misdemeanor.



GOALS OF A REVISED PUBLIC NUISANCE ORDINANCE

- Provide the public with clear guidance on allowed and prohibited activities during social gatherings or parties.
- Discourage the use of bluff and rooftops to prevent falls or collapses.
- Provide law enforcement with authority to shut down dangerous events that have gotten out of control.
- Discourage abuse of residential properties for commercial purposes.
- Discourage underage alcohol and drug distribution and use.
- Prevent overcrowding that leads to cliff and balcony falls and collapses.
- Modernize penalties to be consistent with the level of the offenses.

PUBLIC NUISANCE ORDINANCE CHANGES

- Felonies and serious misdemeanors moved from “three or more” section to “one and done” section.
- 647(a)PC, 417PC, 272(a)(1) PC added to “one and done” section.
- Parties or social gatherings that allow climbing and remaining on a roof are added to “one and done” section.
- Parties or social gatherings that allow climbing over fences, railings, walls, etc. onto exposed bluffs are added to “one and done” section.
- Parties that charge a ticket, fee, or donation are added to “one and done” section.
- Parties that sell alcohol are added to the “one and done” section.



PUBLIC NUISANCE PENALTY CHANGES

- Current progressive penalties of \$100, \$200, \$500 fine.
- Changes to progressive penalties.
 - Hosting a public nuisance becomes a misdemeanor.
 - Refusing to disburse from a public nuisance remains an infraction.
