Medi-Cal Health Coverage

Medi-Cal

- California's version of the federal Medicaid program
- Public health insurance program which provides health care services to low-income individuals
- Collaborates with Covered California for call transfers and in-person health plan selection
- Currently assisting over 168,427 (38%) Santa Barbara County residents





Medi-Cal Health Coverage

Medi-Cal

- Eligibility
 - Varies by Medi-Cal program which can range from no cost to requiring a share-of-cost
- Income Limits: Determining Tax Household and Income
 - Modified Adjusted Gross Income (MAGI) Under 138% Federal Poverty Level
 - Non-MAGI Ex. Long-term Care (LTC), Aged, Blind, and Disabled (ABD)
- Benefit Level
 - Medi-Cal is a comprehensive insurance program with no set benefit level
 - Managed care provider is CenCal Health
 - Behavioral Wellness is the Substance Use Disorder/Severe and Persistent Mental Illness Plan for Medi-Cal


Medi-Cal Statistics

Medi-Cal

- Total Individuals Served (168,427)
 - Adult 92,928 (55%)
 - Seniors 65+ 11,937 (7%)
 - Children 63,562 (38%)
- Demographics:
 - North County: 55%
 - Mid-County: 17%
 - South County: 28%

Continuous Coverage Unwinding April 2023 – June 2024

• Resuming annual renewals for Medi-Cal paused during the COVID-19 Public Health Emergency

California Advancing & Innovating Medi-Cal (CalAIM)

 Multi-year initiative seeking to enhance the health and well-being of individuals by transforming the Medi-Cal system to create a more coordinated, person-centered model of care

Other Expansions

- January 2024: Adult Expansion, Asset Limit Changes fully phased-in
- Potential changes in January 2025: Continuous Coverage for Children, Updating Maintenance Need Level

CalFresh Food Aid

CalFresh

- California's version of the federal Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Provides monthly food benefits to individuals and families with low income
- Currently assisting 60,083 (13.5%) Santa Barbara County residents





CalFresh Food Aid

CalFresh


- Eligibility
 - Household composition, citizenship, resource limits, allowable deductions
- Income Limits
 - Gross income below 200% of Federal Poverty Level (FPL) and net income below 100% FPL
- Benefit Level
 - The allotment is based on household size and household income after deductions
- Time Limit/Work Requirements for Able Bodied Adults without Dependents (ABAWD)
 - The ABAWD time limit of three months in three years is waived in California through 10/31/24

CalFresh

- Total Individuals Served (60,083)
 - Adult 31,108 (52%)
 - Seniors 65+ 6,024 (10%)
 - Children 22,951 (38%)
- Demographics:
 - North County: 55%
 - Mid-County: 17%
 - South County: 28%

• Technology enhancements (EBT Edge, card chip technology)

Updated CalFresh allocation methodology

• Last updated 20+ years ago

CalFresh Utilization Project

- A local initiative credited with improving CalFresh participation.
- Paused for the multi-year California Statewide Automated Welfare System (CalSAWS) implementation, to resume Q4 2023/24

CalWORKs Cash Aid

California Work Opportunity and Responsibility to Kids (CalWORKs)

- California's version of federal Temporary to Needy Families (TANF) program
- Provides families with temporary cash assistance to meet basic needs
- Under the CalWORKs program umbrella: Welfareto-Work, Child Care, and Cal-Learn programs
- Current assisting 8,492 (1.91%) Santa Barbara County residents





CalWORKs Cash Aid

CalWORKs

- Eligibility
 - Family must have a child who is deprived of parental care through a variety of situations (absence, unemployment, disability, death)
 - 100 hour rule, felon status
- Income
 - The current income limit (Earned/Unearned) for a family of 3 is \$1,753 per month
- Benefit Level
 - Maximum Aid Payment (MAP) is based on family size and income
 - MAP for a family of 3 with zero income is \$1,171 (56% of the Federal Poverty Level)
- Time Limits
 - Varies by state, but California matches the federal 60-month time limit

CalWORKs Program Initiatives

CalWORKs Outcomes and Accountability Review (Cal-OAR)

- California's Cal-OAR is a continuous 5-year cycle of performance measurement, self-assessment, and system improvement
- The first 5-year cycle began in 2021 and concludes in 2026

Linkages

- Allows for continuation of CalWORKs services when a child has been removed from the home and is receiving out-of-home care
- Coordination with Welfare-to-Work and Child Welfare Services

General Relief Cash Aid

General Relief

- Small short-term loans to indigent adults who need help meeting their basic shelter and personal needs.
- State mandated County funded.
- Strategic partnerships with CalFresh and Adult Services.
- Currently serving 259 (0.05%) Santa Barbara County residents.

General Relief Cash Aid

General Relief


- Eligibility
 - County resident, 18+ years old (unless married or legally emancipated)
 - One vehicle is exempt if it is used as housing, otherwise \$1,500 vehicle value limit
- Income
 - Gross income must not exceed the Maximum Grant
- Benefit Level
 - Maximum Grant is \$300 for a household of one
- Time limits
 - Employable individuals are limited to three months of assistance in a 12-month period
 - Unemployable individuals do not have a time limit, must cooperate with Supplemental Security Income (SSI) Advocate



General Relief Program Initiatives

Leveraging automation

- CalSAWS is programmed to support General Relief
- Document submission or communication through county online portal (OCTOPUS).

Maintaining relationships and in-person service delivery model

• General Relief cases are served through a caseload model at district offices instead of assigning to the call center.
