**SUBJECT: Contribution of Fifth District Discretionary Funds to One Community Action**

**Recommended Actions:**

That the Board of Supervisors:

- a) Approve and authorize the contribution of \$25,000 to One Community Action, a 501(c)(3) nonprofit (EIN # 82-1489073), from the Fifth District General County Programs Department 990 discretionary fund;
- b) Find that the project provides a community benefit that meets the social needs of the County; and
- c) Determine that the above actions are organizational or administrative activities of the government that will not result in direct or indirect physical changes in the environment and are not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to section 15378(b)(5) of the CEQA Guidelines.

**Summary Text:**

This action will authorize a \$25,000 contribution to One Community Action, helping fund the scope of work for the POR VIDA! Program and R.A.I.C.E.S. Program. POR VIDA! provides intensive case management, mentorship, support groups, and values guidance for at-promise high school students through evidence-based, culturally responsive curriculum. The R.A.I.C.E.S. youth leadership program aims to heal intergenerational trauma, increase awareness of the criminalization of BIPOC youth, and

mobilize lower-to-working-class youth to advocate for systemic change, specifically within academic settings.

**Background:**

Upon adoption of the County’s FY 2023-24 Budget, each supervisorial office was allocated \$100,000 of discretionary funding to direct toward projects and/or programs in the County in need of funding. These funding requests must be approved by the full Board of Supervisors.
