Dear J'Amy;

Thanks for your comments. We have set forth our responses below in the order of your e mail. Please confirm that you received this.

Comment 1: See the reply to Howard's question.

Comment 2: The basis for concluding that Rivera stayed with Frances Rich is the Neal Graffy report, page 15. We view this visit as a simple matter of interest and NOT as a basis for historic merit. It is the ASSOCIATION of the Richs' with the community of the arts and artists that help raise the Richs' to "persons of significance" in local, state, national and international matters as artists themselves. For example, it is through this association that Irene Rich's name appears on Mexico's 500 peso note and demonstrates that she is a person of significance related to Diego Rivera. We do NOT assert that visits by famous people to the cabana in and of themselves make it significant although they do make it interesting to many people and they are a part of its history. We do conclude that the association of the Richs with such people demonstrate the Richs' significance.

The person who has firsthand knowledge of at least some of the famous people who used the cabana beginning in 1969 is Matt Kallens. He lived in the Sea Urchin House that his father built and in the cabana that his father bought from Frances and Irene in 1969. Attached is a brief memo that documents the memories of Kallens and those of his friend Cherie Peake.

Comment 3: There have been an ASTOUNDING number of beach walkers (and for that matter, random acquaintances) who have prepared more than 100 testimonials describing the effect that the cabana has had on them. It is indeed a familiar vista in Hope Ranch. An example from Ron and Carol Stotts is attached.

Comment 4: We are unaware of any

Comment 5: The "Sea Urchin House" was designed by architect Serifo John Menegon. He is local and still alive although reportedly not in the best of health. It is truly "unique" but was built in 1969 so it does not qualify for age.

Comment 6: The cabana is unchanged in any important regard since its construction in 1956. We understand that some up-dating is fully consistent with the intent of the County's land mark rules and there have been up-dates that we believe should not affect its status. The exterior board and batten siding appears mostly original and the roof is replacement cedar shake. Both replicate the original construction faithfully. The deck, bench and railing immediately at the cabana also appear to be of original configuration and redwood material although we do not think that all of the wood is original. The windows have been replaced with double pane glass in sash design as original and in the same basic configuration. The exact original configuration of the interior is unknown but is thought to be an open floor plan. Based on the memory of Matt Kallens and Hope Bryant who were subsequent owners, the Richs had divided the interior into smaller rooms, had added a kitchen and had replaced the "outhouse toilet" with a flush toilet. The owner before us removed the interior walls and kitchen to restore it to a more original configuration. The interior roof trusses and ceiling are original, the wood wall paneling was replaced with wood paneling and the wood flooring with wood flooring. Over the years the outhouse became the storage closet on the east side and a part of the screened porch was enclosed.

Comment 7: Anita has copies of all of the public comments and the two historians' reports (Neal Graffy and San Buenaventura and Associates). We will make ALL available again to assure that there is a complete record. A list of those things is included under "References" in the current submission.


