- Approve budget revision 0002715 establishing appropriations of \$50,000 in Sheriff b). General Fund for overtime funded by unanticipated revenue from Cal EMA Operation Stonegarden Grant.

Summary Text:

On December 4, 2012, the Santa Barbara Sheriff's Office was awarded a grant up to \$ 50,000 from the California Emergency Management Agency (CAL EMA) for participation in Operation Stonegarden. The program enhances law enforcement resources in the detection and investigation of undocumented aliens transporting illegal drugs from Mexico to the United States. The Santa Barbara Sheriff's Office will use the funds for overtime incurred.

Background:

Historically, Los Angeles and San Diego Counties have been highly favored operational areas for alien and drug smuggling organizations to bring illegal drugs, via boat, to the United States. As the maritime threat continues to increase it is now affecting the coastlines of Ventura, Santa Barbara and San Luis Obispo counties. In order to raise the level of boarder security and reduce the threat of border-related crime, law enforcement presence and special operations in rural and coastal areas will help reduce

criminal activity associated with alien and drug smuggling. This grant will allow deputies to assist allied agencies with investigations and interdiction efforts within Santa Barbara County.
