PROJECT DESCRIPTION: Request for the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute the Statement of Final Quantities for the San Ysidro Road Safe Routes to School Sidewalk Project for the work performed and materials supplied by D-Kal Engineering, Inc., in the amount \$341,786. The project consisted of the development of a decomposed granite path along the west side of San Ysidro Road for a length of approximately 0.75-miles, between Jameson Lane to Montecito Union School in the Montecito Area, First Supervisorial District


