Total Contributions

- Contributes a total of \$2.8 billion to the local economy
 - \$1.8 billion in direct economic output
 - \$1.0 billion in multiplier effects
- Infuses \$53.5 million in indirect business tax payments equaling 6.2% of the county's entire annual budget of \$866 million.

Total Contributions

- 25,370 jobs in SBC are attributed to agriculture
 - 15,971 directly related to agriculture
 - 9,399 additional jobs for multiplier effects
 - 3,826 jobs from value-added food processing
 - Wineries accounted for 85.3% of the value-added food processing jobs
- ▶ 1 out of every 10 jobs in the county

Crop Diversity

- High crop diversity
- Provides economic stability
 - √ High economic diversity minimizes risks

- > Shannon-Weaver Index rating of 2.49.
 - ✓ Evaluate trends within the county
 - ✓ Compare diversity to other counties




CDFA
