PROJECT DESCRIPTION: This project will install a level 1 electric vehicle charging station and an energy storage system at the Santa Barbara County Administration Building. The station is secured to a concrete footing within close proximity the existing parking lot that is within a short (25-foot) distance from the existing county-owned building. The Energy Storage system will located in the Adminitration building basement. An underground electrical and communications conduit will be installed in a shallow trench from the charging station to the existing building, where the electrical wiring will be connected to existing electrical services in the building and the communication wiring will be connected to telephone service. The level 1 charging station will be open to the general public to re-charge their electrical vehicles on a fee-for-use basis.
