Recommended Actions:

That the Board of Supervisors:

- A) Adopt the attached resolution ("Resolution") (Attachment A) that authorizes the Chief Probation Officer or designee to:
 - 1) Submit a completed application for Juvenile Accountability Block Grant (JABG) funding in the amount of \$26,784 for the period July 1, 2014, to June 30, 2015 to the Board of State and Community Corrections (BSCC) in a form substantially similar to the template application (Attachment B): and
 - 2) Execute the Grant Agreement with the BSCC in a form substantially similar to the standard grant agreement that was used for FY2013-2014 and upon review and approval of the County Counsel, Auditor-Controller, and Risk Manager or their designees if the JABG funding is awarded (Attachment C); and
- B) Determine that the adoption of the Resolution is not the approval of a project that is subject to environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines section 15378(b)(4), finding that the adoption of the Resolution is not a

Board Letter FY 2013-14 Page 1 of 5 project as it is the creation of government funding mechanisms or other government fiscal activities which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant impact on the environment, and direct staff to file the Notice of Exemption (Attachment D).

Summary Text:

At the May 2, 2014meeting of the Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC), it was agreed that the FY 2014-15 JABG funding should be used to support substance abuse counseling services to youth participating in the Juvenile Drug Court (JDC) program, JDC Sober Activities, and Teen Court/Peer Review services.

Background:

Probation has received Juvenile Accountability and Incentive Block Grant funds from the Federal Office of Criminal Justice Planning (OCJP) since FY 1999-2000. The grant was renamed the Juvenile Accountability Block Grant in FY 2004-2005. The original seventeen program purpose areas remained unchanged.

Since January 2002, JABG funds have been consistently utilized locally. Program Area 8, *Juvenile Drug Courts*, includes the provision of services to youth participating in the County's JDC programs. Teen Court/Peer Review case management of youth in the three geographic regions of the County is funded under Program Area 11, *Accountability*.

Performance Measure:

The Performance Measures for the JDC Program are:

- Ensure at least 65 percent of youth in the JDC graduate successfully. During calendar year 2013, 39 of 69 youth (57 percent) successfully completed the JDC program.
- Ensure that at least 80 percent of JDC graduates do not have a new felony or misdemeanor referral within six months of graduation. In calendar year 2013, 33 of the 39 youth that successfully exiting JDC (85 percent) were not referred for a new felony or misdemeanor within six months of completion.

The Performance Measure for the Teen Court/Peer Review Program is:

Ensure that at least 80 percent of Teen Court/Peer Review graduates referred from probation do
not have a new felony or misdemeanor referral within six months of graduation. The data for the
first quarter of FY13-14 shows that of the 68 successful completions of Teen Court, 67 or 98.5%
did not have a new felony or misdemeanor referral within the six months following their
successful completion.

The JABG funding requires a 10 percent county match, which is reflected as the general fund costs in the chart below.

The JABG funds programs and services surrounding the JDC program and Teen Court/Peer Review Program. The FY 2012-2013 budget amount totaled \$45,676, and the FY 2013-2014 budget amount totaled \$36,502. The FY2014-2015 budget amount reflects a decrease in unding for JABG.
