 - Maintenance Management Plan Report (Phase II)
 later this summer
 - Implementation Plan from GS and CSD-Parks following Phase II report

What Changed since April 9th

- Total DM is now calculated as \$83.6M, previously \$94M
- FCI is now 8.7% (Fair), previously 9.8%
 - GS facilities have a FCI of 5.5%
 - CSD-Parks infrastructure and amenities have a FCI of 17.5%
- More available detail on observed DM projects
 - 68% of DM projects are less than \$5,000
 - Nine projects are over \$1M; totaling \$36.5M

Facility Condition Assessment Report

- 8.5 million square feet of buildings evaluated
- 310 acres of park infrastructure and amenities evaluated
- Evaluated \$965M of \$1.1B portfolio
- Observed \$76.4M of DM projects
- Calculated (including observed projects) total DM backlog of \$83.6M

FCA Report Structure

- Over 500 buildings & park assessments
- Arranged into forty seven report groups
 - Mostly geographic, except all fire stations in one
 - Park amenities in a separate report
- Each report group section includes
 - Sub-section executive summary
 - Facility system assessments with condition codes, replacement value, accumulated DM & FCI
 - Funding model
 - Observed DM project cost detail sheets

Future Options

- Some updating to this data may occur
- Now available for operational decision-making
- Phase II Maintenance Management Plan development process has begun and scheduled to be received later this summer
 - Prioritize DM projects over time
 - Recommendations for maintenance delivery system improvements
- Board may request GS & CSD implementation plans following receipt Phase II report

Recommended Actions

- Receive and file the final draft 2013-14 Facility
 Condition Assessment Report (Phase I) prepared by
 Roy Jorgensen Associates, Inc.;
- Anticipate receiving the Maintenance Management Plan (Phase II) at the end of August 2014;
- Direct staff to return with a report responding to the Facility Condition Assessment and implementing the Maintenance Management Plan within 60 days after receiving the Phase II report; and
- Determine that the above actions are not a project under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA)
