Due to the time sensitivity of acceptance of the SB 82 Investment in Mental Health Wellness Grant, ADMHS docketed Agenda Item A-7 prior to final approval of the Exhibit D, Project Description by the State of California Health Facilities Financing Authority (CHFFA) Board. The CHFFA Board formally approved the final Exhibit D on May 29, 2014, and distributed the revised Agreement to ADMHS on Friday, May 30. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The Project Description, as described in Exhibit A to the Authority's May 29, 2014 Amendment to Resolution No. MH 2014-18 is as follows:

The proceeds of the grant will be used by the County of Santa Barbara as follows:

Crisis Residential Treatment Program

The County of Santa Barbara (the "County") will establish a non-institutional Crisis Residential Treatment Program for mental health clients to receive up to 30 days of respite, peer support, and linkages to ongoing services and resources. The program will increase capacity by adding eight new beds. A County owned low-income residence is currently under consideration for renovation. Services will be provided by a local nonprofit contract provider. The funds will be used for renovation, furnishings and equipment.

Crisis Stabilization Treatment Program

The County will partner with Cottage Hospital to establish its first-ever Crisis Stabilization Unit, designed to provide a safe, nurturing, short-term emergency treatment alternative to hospitalization for individuals experiencing a mental health emergency. The County will identify a suitable building that can accommodate up to 10 consumers daily for stays up to 23 hours. The environment will be designed to be comfortable and non-clinical to provide a calming experience. Services will be provided by the County in close partnership with Cottage Hospital. The funds will be used to purchase, renovate, furnish and equip a building.

Mobile Crisis Support Team Program

The County will establish a mobile crisis support team for the City of Lompoc, which is the only service area without a team. The program will provide rapid response in mental health emergencies. A team will consist of a peer recovery assistant, a mental health specialist, and a psychiatric nurse. Services will be provided by the County. The funds will be used to purchase two vehicles and fund the salaries of 10 staff members.
