MWD is currently in a Water Shortage Emergency. The District passed Ordinance 93 on February 21, 2014 which provides customers with a monthly allocation that equates to the current water supply of approximately 5,300 AF. This allocation will be adjusted as needed to match the available water supply for the upcoming 2014/15 water year. The District is aggressively attempting to acquire approximately 2,000 AF of supplemental State Water to remain under the current rationing program for 2014/15.
