October 7th



- General Services presented a Pilot Project Stabilization Agreement (PSA) to your Board
- The PSA is intended to cover the Northern Branch Jail AB 900 Phase II Project
- County Staff delivered to your Board all the information needed to approve a PSA for the Project
- Tri-Counties Building and Construction Trades Council (TCBT) failed to deliver 100% approval of their trades and affiliates by deadline of October 1st
- A significant trade "refused" to sign
- Resignatures needed to allow extension of time

October 7th



- As a result, your Board continued the item to the 14th and asked TCBT to deliver signatures by noon on October 13th
- Your Board also:
 - Received a report on status of negotiations
 - Received evidence that a PSA furthers a legitimate governmental interest consistent with competitive bidding law
 - Provided conceptual approval of the PSA, as drafted and presented
 - Made California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) finding

October 13th



- TCBT notified staff that Operating Engineers Local 12 will not sign the PSA
- Since TCBT did not obtain ALL signatures, staff
 recommends your Board not pursue a PSA at this time
- TCBT stated they "would not be comfortable pursuing the PSA any further without 100% support from County staff"

Concerns Without 100% Approval



- Kitchell has successfully worked on hundreds of PSAs for public projects and are unaware of the existence of a PSA without 100% local union participation
- Without this level of approval you lose the primary benefit of a PSA; an agreement by ALL trade unions against labor strife for the project
- Different sets of labor requirements would apply to our Project work site leaving the practical implementation of the agreement unclear
- This increases the likelihood of labor and jurisdictional disputes
- Bidders may add costs, if they bid the Project, to account for additional uncertainty and administrative burden
- Adds another layer of complexity beyond what would exist with a PSA signed by 100% of the trades and affiliates

October 14th



- Without 100% TCBT approval staff recommends two options for your Board's consideration:
 - Direct staff to move forward utilizing the Board's previously approved
 Joint Labor Compliance Program in lieu of the Pilot PSA; OR
 - Direct staff to move forward utilizing the Board's previously approved Joint Labor Compliance Program in lieu of the Pilot PSA and begin work to present the Board with a draft Pilot PSA for the SB1022 component of the Northern Branch Jail Project, or other future project; also
- Make required California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) finding

October 14th



- Alternatively, if your Board directs staff to move forward with less than 100% of the signatures:
 - Make findings that a Pilot PSA furthers a legitimate governmental interest consistent with competitive bidding law
 - Approve a revision to the draft PSA that allowed for resignatures of the affiliates after the October 1st deadline
 - Approve and authorize the Chair to sign the Pilot Project Stabilization
 Agreement for the Northern Branch Jail AB 900 Phase II Project
- Make required California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) finding
