### **Summary Text:**

## Membership of the Child Care Planning Council

The membership of the Council is prescribed by law, and must be comprised of 20% consumers (i.e., parents/guardians of children currently or formerly in child care), 20% child care providers or representatives, 20% public agency representatives, 20% community representatives or agencies who advocate for child care, and 20% discretionary appointees. However, when a previously existing Council is designated by the Superintendent of Schools and the Board of Supervisors to act as the local Child Care Planning Council (as occurred in Santa Barbara County) the membership may vary from these prescribed percentages so long as the Council "can achieve the representation set forth" in the statute [Education Code Section 8499.3 (e)]. The Council continues to seek a balance in the five categories of membership defined by law, while also seeking to add members from under-represented populations in the county.

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The California Department of Education requires that the County Education Office and the Board of Supervisors formally approve the membership of the Council. This approval is accomplished through signature by the County Superintendent of Schools and the Chair of the Board of Supervisors on a form entitled "Certification Statement Regarding Composition of LPC Membership July 2014 – 2015" (See Attachment A: "Certification Statement"). The current membership of the Council, as last approved by vote of the Council at its meeting of September 10, 2014, is shown on the attached Certification Statement. County Assistant Superintendent of Schools, Jan Clevenger, has signed the Certification Statement giving her approval of the membership list. The signature of the Chair of the Board of Supervisors is now requested.

## **Background:**

Santa Barbara County's original Child Care Planning Council ("the Council") was formed by the Board of Supervisors and the County Superintendent of Schools in 1990 as a result of the 1990 Federal Omnibus Budget Act. The role of the Council was to develop a local plan and priorities for distribution of the new Federal Child Care Block Grant funds. For its first few years, financial support for the Council's activities was provided entirely through in-kind services donated by the County Office of Education and Council members. Since 1994 the Council has received annual grants from the California Department of Education. Funds provided to the Council are administered by the Santa Barbara County Education Office.

Since the inception of the Council, members have worked to coordinate and plan the delivery of child care services in Santa Barbara County, serve as liaison between the State Department of Education, Child Development Division and the local community, and provide support and training to the Early Childhood Education Community.

Pursuant to the Statutes of 1997, AB 1542, which established California's welfare reform program (CalWORKs), a local Child Care Planning Council must be established in each county (Education Code Chapter 2.3, Sections 8499.3 and 8499). On April 28, 1998, your Board (in conjunction with the Office of the County Superintendent of Schools, which has joint authority over the Council) amended the functions, governance, structure, membership and bylaws of the existing Council to conform to the requirements of welfare reform as defined by AB 1542.
