Project Title: Amendments to the emPower Funding Agreements through 2015

Project Description: emPower Central Coast is the County's voluntary building efficiency program designed to lower energy use across the region and stimulate the economy. Launched in November 2011, emPower provides services that help make it easier and more affordable for homeowners and contractors to complete energy saving improvements, including a low cost financing option administered through an arrangement with CoastHills Credit Union (CoastHills). In June 2013, the County approved additional program funding provided by SCG to continue emPower and expand the program to Ventura and San Luis Obispo (SLO) Counties. SCG funding was originally set to expire in December 2014; SCG is now offering additional \$1.35M in annualized funding and an extended term through December 2015. The Amendments would extend the term and increased funding to the SCG Funding Agreement and the Subrecipient Agreements with Ventura and SLO Counties and Financing Agreements with CoastHills.
