12. EXPERIENCE. Please explain why you are interested in serving and what experience you bring to the Commission or Committee for which you are applying.

I moved to Montecito almost four decades ago, while in college, renting a room for the summer near Cold Spring School. Montecito was an oasis from the traffic, over-development and poor planning afflicting Oxnard and other places where I had grown up in a U.S. Navy family.

I lived several summers in the hills of Montecito while earning a Journalism degree at Ventura College, a Finance degree at the University of Southern California and a Law degree at University of California Hastings College of the Law. I joined a business law firm in Santa Barbara in 1981, and I met Susan, a speech pathologist, now my wife of 30 years. We moved to Montecito permanently in 1986, being fortunate to buy a home on lower Hot Springs Road.

We raised three children in Montecito, participating in the many advantages of our Village. Our family walked the neighborhoods, coached and played at the Y, attended ELMO and MUS, spent summers at Knowlwood, joined dozens of kids and parents in the Montecito Association's July 4th parades, and patrolled Ghost Village Road.

Our kids attended local public junior and senior high schools, with our oldest son graduating from Princeton, our daughter currently a senior at Westmont, and our youngest son now a sophomore at San Marcos High.

Professionally, I practiced transactional real estate and business law, now working from my office in the upper Village as I have for eight years. I stayed close to community and regional public affairs, including while serving as Publisher of the Santa Barbara News-Press, and now as Publisher of the Santa Barbara Independent. I worked collaboratively with many local groups, including serving with seven corporate boards of directors and about a dozen non-profit boards of directors, including several in Montecito.

To me, the trouble in our paradise accelerated in the mid-1980's, although some would argue earlier. Development continued to explode across California. Montecito was not immune.

The mansionization of Montecito was particularly dispiriting, as was the related mounting traffic, congestion and the steady, steady hammering. The cherished semi-rural character of Montecito was visibly being lost. Badly planned development and encroachment already blighted our North County, and our neighboring Ventura and SLO counties. Montecito's own direction was clear.

Our community was fortunate as visionaries stepped up, including Joan Wells, Sally Kinsell, Susan Gulbransen and many others. They were instrumental in forging the Montecito Community Plan in 1992, updated in 1995, and joined then by the Montecito Architectural

Guidelines and Development Standards. These and other policies gave the Montecito Association leverage in protecting Montecito.

Another group of visionaries then worked to establish the Montecito Planning Commission in 2002, with original commissioners "father" Robert Meghreblian, the omnipresent Joan Wells, Dick Thielscher, Bob Bierig, and, of course, Michael Phillips. Progress continues with the Montecito Growth Management Ordinance as recently as 2010.

The results of this effort are apparent when comparing the present against the recent past in planning our aesthetics and the quality of Montecito's future.

But there is work to be done. The crucial efforts of the current Commissioners need to be continued into a new generation. As a lawyer, I understand the need to enforce the policies, regulations and rules governing Montecito. As a newspaper publisher, although content and journalism is outside my purview as the business leader, I understand the importance of regional issues since Montecito does not exist in isolation.

But most of all is that I understand the essence of Montecito as communicated to me by generations of residents who care and by decades of living here. That essence is a stewardship that needs to be carried forward by the MPC. I would like to be part of that work.
