- g) Approve and authorize the Chair of the Board of Supervisors to execute a Fiscal Year 2014-2015 ESG Program Subrecipient Agreement with WillBridge of Santa Barbara, Inc. in the amount of \$7,840.00 (Attachment G); and
- h) Determine that the approval of the Fiscal Year 2014-2015 ESG Program Subrecipient Agreements are not approvals of projects that are subject to environmental review under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15378(b)(4), finding that the projects are a creation of government funding mechanisms or other government fiscal activities, which do not involve any commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment, and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption (Attachment H).

Summary Text:

Approval and authorization of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2014-2015 ESG Program Subrecipient Agreements by the Board of Supervisors will allow grant Subrecipients to provide services related to emergency shelter, rapid re-housing, and homeless prevention through June 30, 2015 to individuals and families who are homeless or at risk of homelessness county-wide.

Background:

On May 6, 2014, the Board of Supervisors approved the FY 2014-2015 Action Plan for final submission to HUD which included ESG Annual Grant Programs. The purpose of the ESG Program is to assist people to quickly regain stability in permanent housing after experiencing a housing crisis or homelessness. ESG Program funds may be used for activities related to street outreach, emergency shelter, rapid re-housing, homelessness prevention, and the Homeless Management Information System. The United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) allocates ESG Program funds to the County of Santa Barbara; the Community Services Department (CSD) administers these funds on the County's behalf. The County competitively awards ESG Program funds to private non-profit organizations to undertake ESG Program-eligible activities.

For FY 2014-2015, HUD allocated \$126,795 in ESG Program funds to the County. Of that amount, 7.5 percent, or \$9,509, may be retained by the County for program administration. Subrecipients are awarded the balance of ESG Program funds totaling \$117,286. Subrecipients, type of project, project description, and award amounts are listed in Table 1 below.

Narrative: As authorized by HUD, the County may use up to 7.5 percent, or \$9,509, of its allocation for program administration. The allocation balance, or \$117,286, will be passed to seven Subrecipients to carry out ESG Program-eligible activities.

Key Contract Risks:

The ESG Program is a federally-funded program subject to associated federal requirements. As the recipient of federal funds, the County is responsible for ensuring that ESG Program Subrecipients use ESG Program funds in accordance with federal requirements. Casa Esperanza Homeless Center, Domestic Violence Solutions for Santa Barbara County, Good Samaritan Shelter, Legal Aid Foundation

of Santa Barbara County, Santa Ynez Valley People Helping People, Transition House, and WillBridge of Santa Barbara, Inc., all have prior experience operating federally-funded homeless assistance projects.

The ESG Program Subrecipient Agreement is a cost-reimbursement contract. This allows CSD to disburse federal funds to the aforementioned ESG Program Subrecipients for eligible incurred costs to the extent prescribed by the Agreement. The County will only reimburse ESG Program Subrecipients for costs that are eligible under the Agreements and documented in a manner that is acceptable to the CSD. CSD staff will assess the performance of ESG Program Subrecipients to determine if services are adequately provided. The County will provide payment after demonstration that reimbursable services were provided.
