The Chimineas Ranch Foundation (CRF) is a IRS 501c3 non-profit corporation whose sole activity is the support of the Carrizo Plain Ecological Reserve (CPER), a California Department of Fish & Wildlife (CDFW) property.

The CRF requests funding for a solar powered water well located on the CPER which will benefit wildlife in the immediate area of State Highway 166 in the Cuyama Valley. While the CRF will administer this project, ownership of the materials will transfer to CDFW upon completion per FGC 13103(g). The project will consist of the relocation of an existing wildlife water trough and the addition of 1 more from near Highway 166 where wildlife is currently exposed to poaching and wildlife-vehicle accidents. A new solar powered pump to bring a water supply back to this trough will be located out of public view using proven theft preventive construction techniques. The current drought situation in Southern California makes this wildlife water project a critical development on these CDFW lands and will improve the habitat of all wildlife per DFG 13103(e). THESE FUNDS WILL BE USED TO PURCHASE SOLAR PANELS FOR THIS PROJECT. This committee previously funded \$2000 for use in obtaining a project related 5000 gal. poly water tank. The original total project cost is being supported with other cash grants by San Luis Obispo

The CPER is located within the Cuyama Valley on the boundary between Santa Barbara County and San Luis Obispo County and includes a section of the Cuyama River. Wildlife populations within the Cuyama Valley habitat are by nature "dual citizens" of the two counties. Access permit records maintained by CDFW show that approximately 60% of the members of the public who are accessing the CPER in the area impacted by this project are Santa Barbara County residents. This project will directly relieve current serious drought impacts to these populations ranging from upland game to deer & elk and enhance those populations in better times.

The workshops shall incorporate the teaching of basic fishing skills, techniques, and gear, offering an introduction to fish species and their habitat in Cachuma Lake and the marine environment of Santa Barbara County. While introducing and discussing the world of fishing, the content and presentations shall include and emphasize conservation, education, the creation of ecological and environmental awareness, and the appreciation of our precious resources such as Cachuma Lake and the ocean. The presentations are such that they are general in scope and can be applied to all aquatic environs, not only to Cachuma and our coast. There will be an introductory opening at which two Department of Fish and Wildlife game wardens address the group and discuss law enforcement, why F & W laws are so important, and what each angler can do to enhance conservation. At the introductory meeting the speaker will discuss the F & W Department, their importance, why we need to acquire licenses as we turn 16 years of age, and how those fees are utilized (i.e. paying warden salaries.) The attendees are divided into six color groups group and each shall pass through six learning stations. During the small group presentations they will learn of propagation,

During these meetings we will discuss both catch and release (philosophy and techniques) and care of catch (no plastic bags,) preparation for cooking, ethics, and environmental and ecological issues. This educational offering will be held in the spring and summer of 2015 providing instruction for a minimum of 50 or more children (7 to 15,) and 30 adults (over 16.) Goodie bags that include an assortment of fishing supplies, hats, tackle, a how-to fishing book, and a copy of the DFW fishing regulations will be presented to each participant.

During our educational excursions, we teach special-needs people (approximately 100 annually) about matters that relate to the outreach goals of the Commission. For example... skills for subsistence/recreational fishing (on SOFTIN trips our fishing is catch & release), utilizing ethical angling practices, identification of marine mammals, shore and sea birds, fish and plants, how sports men and women fund the wildlife management process by paying for biologists and wardens to shape and enforce our wildlife management, how we are the stewards of wild places through marine debris prevention/cleaning and water quality management.

Requested funds will benefit the special-needs community and further SOFTIN's mission to educate them with seafaring lessons and poignant on-the-water experiences, by partially offsetting costs including fuel, gear, bait and teaching materials. Overall costs for SOFTIN are anticipated to be \$18,000 for the year, however this request is for \$1,000 to partially offset our expenses. SOFTIN's program complies with FG Code 13103 item A (Education) By teaching subsistence fishing skills and principles of wildlife management.

Attachment A FISH AND GAME CODE SECTION 13100-13104

- 13100. (a) The amounts paid to and retained in the county treasury pursuant to Sections 12009 and 13003 shall be deposited in a county fish and wildlife propagation fund and expended for the protection, conservation, propagation, and preservation of fish and wildlife, under the direction of the board of supervisors, pursuant to this chapter.
- (b) All proposed expenditures from a county fish and wildlife propagation fund shall be reviewed first at a regular meeting of the county board of supervisors or its designated county fish and game commission to ensure compliance with Section 13103.
- 13101. (a) The board of supervisors of any county may enter into a written agreement with the board of supervisors of one or more counties for the expenditure of any funds deposited in its fish and wildlife propagation fund pursuant to Section 13100 for any purpose authorized by Section 13103 in either, or any, of the counties for the joint benefit of both, or all, of the counties as the judgment of the boards of supervisors may direct. The purchase of real property necessary for that purpose is lawful and title thereto shall be taken in the joint names of each county which contributes funds therefor. The property may be deeded to the state upon the express condition that it shall be employed for the purposes of this chapter within the counties.
- (b) The board of supervisors of one or more counties may enter into a written agreement with the department for the expenditure of any funds deposited in its fish and wildlife propagation fund pursuant to Section 13100 for any purpose authorized by Section 13103.
- 13102. Expenditures from the fish and game propagation fund of any county shall be subject to the provisions of Division 3 (commencing with Section 29000) of Title 3 of the Government Code.
- 13103. Expenditures from the fish and wildlife propagation fund of any county may be made only for the following purposes:
- (a) Public education relating to the scientific principles of fish and wildlife conservation, consisting of supervised formal instruction carried out pursuant to a planned curriculum and aids to education such as literature, audio and video recordings, training models, and nature study facilities.
 - (b) Temporary emergency treatment and care of injured or orphaned wildlife.
 - (c) Temporary treatment and care of wildlife confiscated by the department as evidence.
- (d) Breeding, raising, purchasing, or releasing fish or wildlife which are to be released upon approval of the department pursuant to Sections 6400 and 6401 onto land or into waters of local, state, or federal agencies or onto land or into waters open to the public.
- (e) Improvement of fish and wildlife habitat, including, but not limited to, construction of fish screens, weirs, and ladders; drainage or other watershed improvements; gravel and rock removal or placement; construction of irrigation and water distribution systems; earthwork and grading; fencing; planting trees and other vegetation management; and removal of barriers to the migration of fish and wildlife.
 - (f) Construction, maintenance, and operation of public hatchery facilities.
- (g) Purchase and maintain materials, supplies, or equipment for either the department's ownership and use or the department's use in the normal performance of the department's responsibilities.
- (h) Predator control actions for the benefit of fish or wildlife following certification in writing by the department that the proposed actions will significantly benefit a particular wildlife species.
- (i) Scientific fish and wildlife research conducted by institutions of higher learning, qualified researchers, or governmental agencies, if approved by the department.
- (j) Reasonable administrative costs, excluding the costs of audits required by Section 13104, for secretarial service, travel, and postage by the county fish and wildlife commission when authorized by the county board of supervisors. For purposes of this subdivision, "reasonable cost" means an amount which does not exceed 15 percent of the average amount received by the fund during the previous three-year period, or ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) annually, whichever is greater, excluding any funds carried over from a previous fiscal year.
- (k) Contributions to a secret witness program for the purpose of facilitating enforcement of this code and regulations adopted pursuant to this code.
- (l) Costs incurred by the district attorney or city attorney in investigating and prosecuting civil and criminal actions for violations of this code, as approved by the department.
- (m) Other expenditures, approved by the department, for the purpose of protecting, conserving, propagating, and preserving fish and wildlife.
- 13104. The department may audit, or require the county to audit, expenditures by the county from its fish and wildlife propagation fund in order to determine compliance with this chapter. If, after reviewing the audit, the department determines that expenditures are not in compliance with this chapter, the department may require that
- all expenditures from the fund be temporarily suspended, or it may seek reimbursement of funds that the department determines, based on the audit, were expended improperly, or both.
