Recommended Actions:

- 1. Adopt a Resolution authorizing County Officials to execute a Grant Agreement for oil spill response equipment with the State of California Department of Fish and Wildlife—Office of Spill Prevention and Response (CDFW-OSPR), (Attachment 1).
- 2. Determine the Grant Agreement, and Board action herein, is categorically exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act in compliance with Section 15061 (b), (3), (No possibility of impact on the environment), (Attachment 3).

Summary Text:

This equipment grant is part of the CDFW-OSPR's coordinated response with federal, state and local governments to manage off shore oil spills or incidents. On March 10, 2015 the Board adopted a resolution approving a grant agreement for equipment to be placed at Goleta Beach Park. Additionally, CDFW-OSPR has made available to Santa Barbara County OEM equipment grant funding of approximately \$30,000 in equipment and supplies to facilitate local government near shore oil spill response. This second equipment grant will provide additional resources consisting of a trailer

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measuring 7 feet by 11 feet and spill response supplies for other county locations. The trailer will be placed at the County Emergency Operations Center at 4408 Cathedral Oaks Road. CDFW-OSPR provides the equipment and training. The Santa Barbara County Office of Emergency Management (OEM) has previously secured its role as part of the unified command structure representing the Operational Area and its jurisdictions. Being part of the unified command ensures local government representation during off shore oil incidents.

Background:

The Office of Emergency Management (OEM) cooperates with CDFW-OSPR and the US Coast Guard to ensure consistency between Federal, State and the Operational Area oil spill contingency actions, responsibilities and authorities. The Board is required under the terms of the CDFW-OSPR grant to adopt a Resolution authorizing execution of the grant.

Performance Measure:

OEM and Parks staff will participate in the CDFW-OSPR equipment grant.
