RE: MIRAMAR CONDITIONS APPEAL

Respected Supervisor Carbajal:

In regards to the Miramar appeals that will be before you for decision in the near future, we, as a group of some of the most immediate neighbors of the project are writing to express our support of the proposed Caruso Affiliated revised development plan, and our opposition to some of the conditions imposed by the Montecito Planning Commission.

The overwhelming sentiment of the property's immediate neighbors is to move forward with the revised project immediately, as proposed by the applicant. Please consider the construction and permanent jobs that would be created, and the bed tax, sales tax, and vastly increased property tax that this project will generate for the entire County of Santa Barbara. This revised project of 170 rooms is the most beautiful and least impactful Miramar project proposed to date. While we support any efforts to redevelop the Miramar site by Rick Caruso and his company Caruso Affiliated, the revised 170 room plan is our strong preference as it directly responds to the needs and concerns of the community and achieves the cottage style architecture that Montecito requires.

If we want a first class hotel that the Montecito community craves and deserves, the hotel must be able to have 200 beach club memberships at initial occupancy. We stand behind the County Planning and Development Department and County Public Works department in their assessment that parking for the hotel is adequate for all of its uses at both 200 beach club memberships, and 300 beach club memberships. An arbitrary reduction to 100 memberships does not have our support.

Furthermore, the hotel must be allowed to have 400 event attendees on site at a given time. This hotel needs to remain competitive with the Biltmore, and other projects in the area to be a vibrant part of our community. We, immediate neighbors of the project, are comfortable with the

parking plan. We are confident this plan will work without spillover into our neighborhood. In the unlikely event the parking plan does not work, we are confident there are adequate safe guards in place in the conditions of approval, and county compliance measures to give us the comfort we need should any minor issues arise in the future.
