

Project Update – AB 900 Schematic





NORTHERN BRANCH JAIL OVERALL FLOOR/SITE PLAN

The Project Delivery and Construction Agreement (PDCA), approved by the Board in May 2013, included the following provisions:

- The County agreed, as to form, to lease the site to the CDCR through a Ground Lease
- Concurrently, The CDCR agreed, as to form, to authorize the County to enter the site for the purpose of constructing the project through a Right of Entry agreement
- The form of both documents was included in the PDCA as exhibits B and C.


Ground Lease / Right of Entry


Traditional Program

- Multiple Insurers

- Control
- Cost Reduction
- Elimination of Redundant costs and contractor mark-up
- Higher Limits
- Consistent Coverage
- Coordinated Claims and Loss Control
- Minimize Cross Litigation/ Subrogation

- Small Business Participation



Owners Controlled Insurance (OCIP)

OCIP Benefits

- Owner control over the insurance program
- Cost reduction in comparison to traditional construction insurance
- Higher limits and broader coverage
- Consistent coverage for the duration of the project, including a ten year period of completed operations coverage following project completion
- Coordinated claims and loss control
- Reduces administrative burden on county personnel
- Minimize cross litigation / subrogation
- Larger contractor pool and small business participation

OCIP Drawbacks

- County has never utilized OCIP on a construction project
- Contractors may not be familiar with OCIP

Owners Controlled Insurance (OCIP)

Potential Cost Savings

Figures shown as a percentage of hard cost construction value, currently estimated at \$64.45M

- Estimated Contractor Insurance Costs: 2.25 3.25%
- Estimated OCIP Costs (Premium & Broker administration fee): 1.93 2.10%
- Estimated Savings = 0.32 (\$206,000) 1.32% (\$850,000)

Permission to Bid

Bid Package A- On-Site Work.

- Estimated construction value of \$62.2M.
- Encompasses site work, onsite utilities, and construction of the 376 bed Jail facility.
- Bidding limited to the 9 prequalified contractors.

Permission to Bid

Bid Package B- Off-Site Work

- Estimated contract value of \$2.25M.
- Includes extension of potable water service, recycled water, and sewer along Black Road to service connection points south of the project, as well as street improvements.
- Bidding open to all licensed responsible contractors who are qualified and able to submit a responsive bid.
