Proposed Amendments to Tobacco Control Ordinance – Chapter 37 Santa Barbara County Code

Background

- The basis for most of the County's existing Smoking Control Ordinance is 20 years old and previous updates were patched onto the old framework.
- There are substantial health and safety threats from the byproducts and use of electronic smoking devices (ESDs).
 - ESDs include single use and refillable/rechargeable types of electronic cigarettes and vaporizing products.
 - ESD cartridge contents, flavorings and product emissions are not harmless.

Electronic Smoking Devices

- Battery-powered devices that provide inhaled doses of nicotine and/or flavorings by heating and vaporizing a solution.
- Concerns with ESDs include:
 - Increased exposure to chemical emissions, including at least 10 on California's Proposition 65 list of known carcinogens
 - Enormous increases in poisonings
 - Lack of regulation contents, dosing, hardware
 - False claims about efficacy as a quitting aid
 - Use among youth has doubled or tripled based on national, state and local data, even at elementary school levels
 - Used to deliver drugs (marijuana, meth, etc.)
 - Marketing aggressively targets youth
 - May renormalize tobacco use and create a new generation of nicotine addicts







Rationale

- Apply consistent regulation smoking, tobacco and electronic smoking device (ESDs) use in public places and workplaces.
- Decrease exposure to secondhand smoke and aerosol emissions.
- Limit access to tobacco and ESDs, especially to youth.
- Minimize smoking and drug delivery device use in public settings.
- Improve compliance and enforcement efforts.

Key Changes

- Expand the "Findings" to reflect research on electronic smoking devices.
- Update and clarify the "Definitions" and "Purpose" of the law.
- Organize prohibitions and exceptions for clarity and comprehensiveness.
- Primary modifications apply in outdoor areas and to the retail environment.
- Salient changes will be detailed by comparing the old and new provisions of the law

Proposed Change

Current County Code

Regulates Smoking, Tobacco Product & Electronic Smoking Device (ESD) use

1. Regulates Smoking, except Tobacco & ESDs are prohibited in County Parks & few departmental sites

2. Prohibits Smoking & Tobacco/ESD use surrounding County facilities including parking lots

2. Inconsistent Smoking regulations outside County sites:

 Prohibited - Courts & District Attorney & Parks Limited areas - Public Health, ADMHS & Social Services

• 20 feet from area/building where smoking is prohibited

Department Head & CEO may prohibit at entire site

Regulates Smoking & Tobacco/ESD use:

Prohibits in all Outdoor Dining Areas

Restrictions on Bar patios include ESD emissions

3. Regulates Smoking:

 Prohibits on 75% of outdoor seating areas at restaurants & restaurant-bars provided that smoke doesn't enter adjacent worksites or residences

 Allows use in all Bar patios provided that smoke doesn't drift into areas specified above

4. Prohibits Smoking & Tobacco/ESD use at Not regulated Public Events (festivals, fairs, parades, etc.)

Current County Code

Prohibits Smoking & Tobacco/ESD use at construction sites

6. Prohibits Smoking & Tobacco/ESD use at common outdoor areas of multi-unit residences (pools & tot lots, etc.)

- 8. Prohibits free distribution and promotion of **Tobacco & ESDs Products & Paraphernalia on** property open to the public
- Regulated by the state on "public" property
- Specifies food-service restrictions in Tobacco **Retail Shops & ESD Retail Shops**
- Implies food-service restrictions in tobacco retail shops based on Labor Code 6404.5 mandates

- Recommendations presented support public health and are aligned with the goals of the County of Santa Barbara.
- Local policy change would mirror 131 communities statewide and 5 local cities that have regulated ESDs.
- The proposed amendments will provide increased protection for youth and diverse populations and promote health and safety in Santa Barbara County.
