Recommended Actions:

- A. That the Board of Supervisors approve and authorize the Chair to execute the Agreement for Services of Independent Contractor with Regents of the University of California to provide evaluations and reports on how the California Community Corrections Performance Incentives Act of 2009 (SB678) and the Public Safety Realignment Act (AB109) are being implemented with a total contract amount not to exceed \$124,293 (Attachment A).
- B. Determine that these activities are exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), finding that these activities are covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that these activities may have a significant effect on the environment, the activities are not subject to CEQA, and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption (Attachment B).

Summary Text: Professors Jill Sharkey and Merith Cosden of the University of California, at Santa Barbara (UCSB) will evaluate and report on the implementation of the California Community Corrections Performance Incentives Act of 2009 (SB678) and the Public Safety Realignment Act (AB109) with recommendations to the Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) and the local criminal justice system on how to improve local probation practices to reduce recidivism for felony probationers, Post Release Community Supervision (PRCS) and Post Sentences Supervision (PSS) clients. UCSB will also provide group process evaluations of at least one of the county's collaborative courts, with

follow-up assessments designed to examine long-term functioning and to assess the integration of recommendations. The Agreement is funded through the California Community Corrections Performance Incentives Act of 2009 (SB678) and the 2011 Public Safety Realignment Act (AB109).

Background: The California Community Corrections Performance Incentives Act of 2009 (SB678) provides funding to probation departments based on achieved reductions in the failure rate of adult felony probationers. The State defines a failure as an adult probationer who was sent to state prison for a revocation of probation, as well as adult felony probationers sent to state prison for a conviction of a new felony offense. Through successful reductions in the failure rate, SB678 funding is being received from the State.

The 2011 Public Safety Realignment Act (AB109) transferred responsibility for specified lower level inmates and parolees from the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation (CDCR) to counties. This change was implemented on October 1, 2011. The Community Corrections Partnership (CCP) in each county is required to develop a Public Safety Realignment Act Plan for the subject population. Santa Barbara County's FY 2015-2016 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan, as developed by the CCP and approved by the Executive Committee of the CCP, was approved by the Board of Supervisors on April 21, 2015. The services for Realigned offenders recommended in these Agreements and related expenditures were included in the County's FY 2015-2016 Public Safety Realignment Act Plan.

Execution of the UCSB Agreement will inform and improve local probation practices and service delivery through continuous development and updating of a comprehensive evaluation plan, providing reports regarding identified indicators, and coordinating and managing all data collection evaluation of services designed to decrease criminal thinking, reduce drug and alcohol dependence, reduce criminal reoffending, improve mental health, and improve functioning in the community. Evaluations of one the county's collaborative courts will also be provided.
