Recommendations Summary

- Accept and approve the most recent version of the Environmental Health Service's "Local Agency Management Program".
 - Latest version incorporates revisions recommended by the Central Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board.
- Direct the Environmental Health Services Director to submit the LAMP to the Regional Water Quality Control Board for approval.



Background


- 2014 December 9: BoS approves draft LAMP and adopts ordinance to establish Onsite Wastewater Treatment Systems (OWTS) in County Code.
- 2015 January 12: Draft LAMP is submitted to Regional Water Board.
- June 19: Regional Water Board submits written request for changes to SB County LAMP.
- Today Final version of LAMP, with requested changes, is presented to BoS.



Requested Changes

 Language added to confirm that if Water Board finds a water body is negatively impacted by the use of OWTS, enhanced requirements will be implemented and that EHS will work in conjunction with the Water Board to develop a plan specifically for that defined area.



Requested Changes

- Language added stating the County will use data from available sources consistent with the State OWTS Policy.
 - OWTS Policy requires an assessment plan to determine if LAMP is attaining its objective. The Policy provides a variety of sources that could be used to obtain data for the assessment plan.


Section III, Page 26



Requested Changes

- Wording added to explicitly state that annual reports will be submitted in a format acceptable to the Water Board
 - Permit activities and complaints are reported annually
 - Evaluation of the water quality monitoring reports are submitted every 5 years

Section XI, Page 57





- The Water Board developed a Checklist to assist in determining whether the LAMP includes all of the elements contained in the State OWTS Policy.
- Checklist included as Appendix 8 and acts as a cross reference between the State OWTS Policy, the LAMP and County Code.
