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# **Recommended Actions:**

That the Santa Barbara County Board of Supervisors:

- a) Accept the grant of equipment and labor valued at \$35,130 by Approving and Authorizing the Chair to execute the attached Central Coast Charge Ahead Project – Approval to Proceed Agreement;
- b) Approve the attached Budget Revision Request(BJE No. 0003735) in the amount of \$35,130 for electric vehicle charging stations; and
- c) Find that the proposed action consists of constructing and locating a limited number of new, small facilities and is therefore exempt from California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to 14 CRR 15303(d) and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption based on that finding.

## Summary Text:

The County of Santa Barbara (COSB) has been awarded a grant of three (3) electric vehicle charging stations with ChargePoint America under the California Energy Commission (CEC) PON-13-606 solicitation at no initial cost to the County. The PON-13-606 group solicitation area includes the Counties of Ventura and Santa Barbara, the Cities of Ventura, Santa Barbara, Carpinteria, Goleta, Buellton, Arroyo Grande, Paso Robles, the City of Santa Barbara Airport, Moorpark College, and Hearst Castle. The grant to COSB includes material and installation of the three new charging stations. ABM,

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the company contracted by the EV Alliance to install the charging stations has determined the beneficiary value of this program award and the associated services is approximately \$35,130.

The electric vehicle charging stations use the ChargePoint<sup>™</sup> Network to bill the car owner for the electricity they consume from the car chargers. The County of Santa Barbara will pay a two (2) year subscription fee of \$2,760 for the ChargePoint<sup>™</sup> Network Commercial Service Plan, (the "Master Services Agreement") associated with the proposed charging stations.

The County currently owns and operates 8 charging stations (6 public, 2 for county fleet vehicles). The existing public charging stations utilize ChargePoint<sup>TM</sup> to charge the cost of electricity through a credit card purchase to the car owner (via the ChargePoint<sup>TM</sup> Network on each station). The County is currently being reimbursed for the cost of electricity by ChargePoint at a rate of \$0.45 for each hour a vehicle charges. In three years of operation, this rate structure has resulted in a negative variance of approximately \$1,000 for operating the existing charging stations. If approved by the Board, prior to the proposed stations being put into operation, General Services will return to the Board with a proposed revised rate structure designed to fully recover the cost of operating the charging stations.

# **Background:**

On February 7, 2012 the County of Santa Barbara Board of Supervisors approved the ChargePoint California Station Award Agreement, the ChargePoint Master Services Subscription Agreement (Attachment 3), and accepted the grant of equipment and labor valued at \$105,967.38 for electric vehicle charging stations. A total of 6 charging stations (2 charging ports per station) were installed in the following locations and are available for public use:

105 E. Anapamu Street, Santa Barbara
511 E. Lakeside Parkway, Santa Maria
260 N. San Antonio Road, Santa Barbara
1109 West Chestnut Ave, Lompoc
2297 Finney Road, Summerland (Lookout Beach Park)
101 Freeway, Bates Road, Carpinteria (Rincon Beach Park)

The stations were put in operation in June 2012. Since then, they have been accessed 6,024 times (as of August 10, 2015), generating approximately \$4,200 in revenue. Included in the initial grant of the stations were two years of free access to the ChargePoint Network. During this time, the County did not pay ChargePoint Network Service Fees. The County's free access to the ChargePoint Network ended in January 2014. Since January 2014, the County has assumed responsibility for maintenance of the stations, and has paid the ChargePoint Network Service Fees of \$230 per port per year (\$2,760 annually) for these stations. These fees cover software upgrades, station programming, cellular connections, and 24/7 driver support.

If approved by the Board, this new grant will provide for 3 additional public charging stations (2 charging ports per station) to be installed at the following locations.

881 Embarcadero Del Mar, Isla Vista (2 stations) (Isla Vista Solar Parking lot)
4436 Calle Real, Santa Barbara (1 station) (Santa Barbara Sheriff Parking Lot)

# Fiscal and Facilities Impacts:

In 2014, the Sheriff's Office installed underground conduit and a concrete base in preparation for the future installation of a public charging station. Other than the cost of this work, there are no additional costs to the County for acquiring and installing the equipment associated with this agreement, and for

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the first two years following installation of the charging stations, maintenance of the stations will be free. The County will, however, pay for the electricity flowing through the stations and pay the ongoing ChargePoint Network Services Fee of \$230 per year/per port. The two-year network services fee must be paid in full prior to the commissioning of the charging stations. The costs will be \$230 per year per port for 6 ports (2 ports per station) for two years. This is a total of \$2,760 for two years for the three new proposed charging stations. The Network Service Fee costs will come from the General Fund.

The charging stations rate structure should recover the costs of operating the charging stations by charging the users of the stations. As noted earlier, in the first two years of operation, the current rate structure resulted in a negative variance for the existing charging stations. Prior to the proposed stations going on line, General Services will return to the Board for consideration of a revised rate structure designed to fully recover the cost of operating the charging stations.

### Key Contract Risks:

Although the rate structure for use of the charging stations is designed to fully recover the cost of operating the charging stations, variable electric rates as well as uncertainty in the expected utilization rates of the charging stations make it difficult to predict the amount of revenue generated by the stations.
