Recommended Actions: That the Board of Supervisors consider the following recommendations:

- a) Approve and authorize the Public Health Director to sign Grant Agreement Number 15-10114 with the California Department of Public Health WIC Supplemental Nutrition Program for the period of October 1, 2015 through September 30, 2019 for a total amount of \$15,008,626.
- b) Determine that these activities are exempt from California Environmental Quality Act review per CEQA Guideline Section 15378(b)(4), since the recommended actions are government fiscal activities which do not involve commitment to any specific project which may result in a potentially significant physical impact on the environment.

Summary Text:

This item is on the agenda for approval and authorization to sign an Agreement with the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) for the Santa Barbara County Women, Infants and Children (WIC) Supplemental Nutrition Program. Approving the agreement will allow for the funding of WIC services by the Public Health Department for Federal Fiscal Years 2016-2019.

Background:

The WIC Program is a federally funded health and nutrition program for women who are pregnant, breastfeeding, or just had a baby, and infants and children under 5 years old including foster children. To be eligible for WIC, a family must have an income at or below 185% of the Federal poverty level

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which currently is \$44,863 for a family of four. WIC provides nutrition, health and breastfeeding education, checks to purchase healthy foods and referrals to health care and other community services.

Santa Barbara County WIC has been operational since 1975, and is one of 84 WIC agencies funded through the California Department of Public Health. In the past year Santa Barbara County WIC served an average of 17,400 participants per month from four permanent offices and five satellite locations throughout Santa Barbara County.
