

BACKGROUND

- AHA performed an assessment of our Animal Services program January through April 2015
- In June, AHA presented 14 key findings and many recommendations
- Today we provide an initial 3 month report on the process and approach for addressing recommendations

OVERSIGHT TEAM

- Separate meetings were held with key partners and a neutral facilitator to work through longstanding tensions and additional members were added to the Oversight Team

OVERSIGHT TEAM PROCESS

Review of each of the recommendations listed in the assessment and categorize as:

- Already being done
- Quick win (within 3 months with no new resources)
- Implement in the future
- Will not implement
- More discussion

There are some recommendations that fall into more than one category.

ALREADY BEING DONE

Many in this category relate to the area of safety and new positions including:

- Conduct OSHA training
- Conduct hazards assessment
- Initial spring cleaning of all outdoor areas
- Install surveillance system
- Ensure employees handling wildlife have rabies vaccines

QUICK WINS

Many in this category are facility and organizationally related including:

- Weigh animals on intake
- Promote overlooked animals
- Devise a robust rabbit adoption program
- Start an active discussion regarding dogs exhibiting severe emotional distress and create action plan
- Improve medical care to alleviate suffering and improve adoptability

Continue categorization and prioritization
