Re: Venoco Ellwood Pipeline lease extension agreement

Recent events have heightened the concerns of many people, including

members of the League of Women Voters, about the safety of oil and gas

pipelines. Consequently we offer some comments on the proposed extension of the

lease for the Ellwood pipelines from Platform Gail to the shore.

We agree with the staff recommendation that only a temporary 18-month

extension be granted. A decision on a longer extension should not be made until a

proper evaluation is made of the various factors affecting the pipelines' safe

operation.

The League also agrees with the Environmental Defense Center's call for a

third party examination of the inspection reports for the pipelines. "Trust but

verify" is a good principle to follow when the accuracy of vitally important data is

involved.

Lastly, since the League always advocates for an informed public and

encourages participation in decisions, we urge you to hold public hearings when

your investigation is complete and the decision is to be made.
