

STATE GAS TAX ALLOCATION:

- 1,660 LANE MILES MAINTAINED BY THE COUNTY
- INTENDED FOR USE ONLY ON THOSE ROADS

ROADS

1,660 lane miles

- Arterials
- Collectors
- Residential
- Rural

BIKE AND PEDS

sidewalk, bike paths and trails

TREES

over 10,000 urban and rural trees

DRAINAGES

approximately 4,000 structures

TRAFFIC

signals, signs and other devices

THE COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM - RESOURCES

ROAD MAINTENANCE

ROADS

45 lane miles for every maintenance worker


TREES and SIDEWALKS

One crew of six for the entire county

DRAINAGES: 105 structures for every maintenance worker

TRAFFIC

- One Engineer for north and south county
- one crew of six for all the signs, markings, and striping
- One crew of two for all operations



ENGINEERING

Two supervising engineers and two full time project managers for (typical):

- 3-5 Major capital maintenance projects annual
- 10+ Major capital replacement and rehab projects ongoing
- ~10 Major capital improvement projects ongoing
- Minor projects, etc.

- AGENCIES REQUESTING COUNTY RESOURCES:
 - SANTA BARBARA COUNTY ASSOCIATION OF GOVERNMENTS (SBCAG)
 - CALTRANS
- REQUESTS OF COUNTY RESOURCES FOR:
 - SAFETY, OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE
 - CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS

OUTSIDE AGENCY REQUESTS - REASONS

SBCAG

- LACK OF STAFF/FUNDING
- FOCUS ON OTHER PROJECTS/DIFFERING PRIORITIES

CALTRANS

- STAFFING AND FUNDING CHALLENGES
- NEW MANDATES SHIFT FUNDING AND RESOURCE PRIORITIES
- STRATEGIC PLANNING TO REDUCE LIABILITIES:
 - TRANSFER ROADS TO LOCAL AGENCIES
 - FORWARDING REQUESTS FOR SERVICE OR PROJECTS TO AGENCIES
 - PLACING MAINTENANCE RESPONSIBILITY FOR NEW PROJECTS ON LOCAL AGENCIES

OUTSIDE AGENCY REQUESTS

STATE EFFORTS TO REDUCE LIABILITIES:

From the State Smart Transportation Initiative (January 2014)

- "Caltrans should find ways to transfer local-serving roads to local government"
- "Caltrans and CalSTA should negotiate coverage for <u>long-term</u> <u>maintenance</u>, <u>resurfacing</u>, <u>and reconstruction costs</u> when locally controlled STIP and LTST funds are used to add capacity to state highways."

From proposed SB254:

Relinquishment "shall not obligate the department for widening, new construction, or major reconstruction...A state of good repair requires maintenance...including litter removal, weed control, and tree and shrub trimming to the time of relinquishment."

OUTSIDE AGENCY REQUESTS - EXAMPLES

UNION VALLEY PARKWAY BARRIER WALLS

- REGIONAL MEASURE A NAMED PROJECT
- SBCAG BOARD VOTED TO FUND THE PROJECT
- COUNTY STAFF DELIVERING THE PROJECT

SANTA CLAUS LANE BIKE PATH

- REQUIRED AS PART OF THE 101HOV PROJECT
- SHARED JURISDICTIONS: ~90-95% in CALTRANS, ~5-10% in COUNTY and CARPINTERIA RIGHT OF WAY
- COUNTY AND CARPINTERIA PROVIDING DESIGN FUNDING AND ASKED TO PARTICIPATE IN MAINTENANCE

SAN YSIDRO INTERCHANGE

- SBCAG BOARD DIRECTED SBCAG STAFF TO PURSUE INTERCHANGE IMPROVEMENTS WITH 101HOV PROJECT
- COUNTY CONTRIBUTED FUNDING AND STAFF TO EXAMINE IMPACTS TO COUNTY ROADS. US101 AND RESIDENTS

OUTSIDE AGENCY REQUESTS - EFFECTS

REDUCTION OF RESOURCES TO COMPLETE COUNTY PROJECTS

OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE REQUESTS

- REDUCES STAFF AND FUNDING AVAILABLE TO WORK ON COUNTY SAFETY, OPERATIONS, MAINTENANCE PRIORITIES
- POTENTIALLY ADDS TO COUNTY LIABILITY

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT REQUESTS

- DELAYS CAPITAL PROJECT SCHEDULES
 - STAFF DIVERTED FROM COUNTY PROJECTS FOR OUTSIDE AGENCY WORK
 - FUNDING AND GRANT OPPORTUNITIES DIVERTED FOR OTHER WORK
- COUNTY REQUIRED TO DESIGN AND DELIVER USING CALTRANS PROCESS

OUTSIDE AGENCY REQUESTS - DISCUSSION

PRIORITIES FOR COUNTY WORK VS. OUTSIDE AGENCY REQUESTS

- REFER SAFETY, OPERATIONS, AND MAINTENANCE REQUESTS ON STATE FACILITIES TO CALTRANS
 - SHARED MAINTENANCE IS SHARED LIABILITY
- CAPITAL PROJECTS IMPACTING BOTH STATE AND COUNTY ROADS:
 - SEEK COMMITMENT FOR COMMENSURATE RESOURCES AND EFFICIENT PROJECT DELIVERY
