Project Description: The Indemnity Agreement is a standard written agreement for the assumption of risk, waiver of liability, and indemnity for retention of existing revetments at Goleta Beach per Special Condition No. 5 of the CDP. Compliance is required prior to the CCC's final issuance of the CDP.

Reasons to support exemption findings (attach additional material, if necessary):

Although the CCC previously certified a Local Coastal Program for Santa Barbara County, the majority of the revetment retention at Goleta Beach is within an area where the CCC has retained jurisdiction over the issuance of CDPs. In this case, the County and the CCC agreed on a consolidated jurisdictional process to review the CDPs required by this project. Pursuant to Section 30601.3(b) of the Coastal Act, the standard review for this project is found in the Chapter 3 policies of the Coastal Act (commencing with Public Resources Code section 30200), with the County's certified Local Coastal Program used as guidance. Section 13096(a) of the CCC's administrative regulations require CCC approval of a CDP application to be supported by a finding showing the application, as conditioned by any conditions of approval, is consistent with any applicable requirements of CEQA. Feasible mitigation measures adopted to minimize all adverse environmental effects of the project were required by the CCC as special conditions. The CCC found no feasible alternatives or feasible mitigation measures available, beyond those required, which would substantially lessen any significant adverse impact that the project may have on the environment, and that the project is consistent with the requirement of the Coastal Act, in accordance with CEQA Guidelines.
