## **Recommended Actions:**

- A. Adopt the attached resolution authorizing the Chief Probation Officer to submit the grant proposal and to execute the Grant Award Agreement and accept the anticipated funding of the 2016 Board of State and Community Corrections, Racial and Ethnic Disparity (RED) Grant in the amount of \$147,480 for the period covering October 1, 2015, to September 30, 2016. (Attachment A)
- B. Approve the attached budget revision recognizing (\$111,005) in current year Federal revenue with an equivalent increase to appropriations. The remaining (\$36,475) will be included in the Departments FY 2016-17 proposed budget (Attachment B) (4/5 vote required);
- C. Determine that the approval of the Agreement is exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3), finding that this activity is covered by the general rule that CEQA applies only to projects which have the potential for causing a significant effect on the environment, and where it can be seen with certainty that there is no possibility that this activity may have a significant effect on the environment, the activity is not subject to CEQA, and direct staff to file a Notice of Exemption (Attachment C).

#### **Summary Text:**

On December 2, 2014, the Board of Supervisors authorized the Chief Probation Officer to execute the Formula Grant Award Agreement, and accept the anticipated funding of the 2015 Board of State and Community Corrections, Racial and Ethnic Disparity (RED) Grant to address unequal treatment of youth of color involved in the juvenile justice system. Santa Barbara County Probation successfully completed the first year of the RED Grant, which was the assessment phase, and has been awarded second year funding in the amount of \$147,480 for the period covering October 1, 2015, to September 30, 2016. Chief Probation Officer Guadalupe Rabago requests authority to execute the Grant Award Agreement and accept second year funding.

#### **Background:**

Santa Barbara County Probation successfully completed the first year of the grant with the assistance of the University of California, Santa Barbara (UCSB). UCSB assessed Santa Barbara High School, Lompoc Unified School, and Santa Maria Joint Union High School Districts and determined there was racial and ethnic disparity pertaining to Black and Hispanic males, youth with low-income backgrounds, and students without English Proficiency.

In 2015 Probation implemented a Graduated Sanctions and Incentives Matrix (Matrix) to assist the Department with balanced approach to rehabilitation of youthful offenders. With this year's grant funds, Probation would focus on tracking outcomes associated with the Matrix to ensure the Matrix does not contribute to racial and ethnic disparity in the rehabilitation of youthful offenders. Identified goals would be to establish consensus on the purpose of secure detention in Santa Barbara County and develop a process for reviewing intake assessment data to ensure objectivity and equity in detention decision-making.

In October, Probation hosted a RED meeting with community and stakeholders to review a Readiness Assessment Consultant (RAC) report prepared by the W. Haywood Burns Institute, and develop committees to work towards community engagement, system stakeholders' engagement and collaboration. The RAC report described the essential components to reducing racial and ethnic disparities in the Juvenile Justice System. The RED meetings will have sub committees of Governance Structure, Data Capacity and Utilization, Collaboration, and Education. The goals and objectives of Governance will be: (1) Convene a collaborative body of key stakeholders to oversee RED effort (2) RED committee will formalize a process for training and orienting new RED committee members (3) RED committee will participate in training which will highlight essential components to successful RED reduction efforts (4) Invest in providing Implicit Bias training for a wide range of system and community stakeholders (5) RED committee will establish consensus on the purpose of secure detention in Santa Barbara County. The goals and objectives for data capacity and utilization will include: (1) Ensure data accuracy and appropriate data is being collected (2) Develop data reports to regularly track progress (3) RED committee will convene a sub-committee focused on developing a process for reviewing intake assessment data to ensure objectivity and equity in detention decision-making. Goals and objectives for collaboration will include: (1) Create an updated multilingual service directory (2) Provide an orientation for families of youth new in the Juvenile Justice System (3) Develop a youth and family advisory council that will be responsible for providing input into policy and/or practice changes developed by the RED committee. Lastly, the goals and objectives of education will be to educate the public in RED and assist the schools in addressing gaps in services that contribute to RED.

Probation continues to be in a position to assist the community and partner agencies to work toward the elimination of racial and ethnic disparities across the juvenile justice continuum. Funding will be used to contract with instructors to provide implicit bias training and consultants to address infrastructure needs and education, strengthen the foundation for the RED initiative, more actively engage the community, and implement a plan with improved demonstrated outcomes.
