WHEREAS, in 2004, California voters passed Proposition 69, the DNA Fingerprint, Unsolved Crime and Innocence Protection Act. The Act levied an additional penalty of one dollar for every ten dollars, or part of ten dollars, in each county upon every fine, penalty, or forfeiture imposed and collected by the courts for all criminal offenses, including all offenses involving a violation of the Vehicle Code; and

WHEREAS, in March 2005, upon the request of the County Treasurer's Office, the Board of Supervisors authorized the Auditor-Controller to establish a DNA Identification Fund; and

WHEREAS, in 2011, AB 434 (Logue), was passed, and provided, in part, that if authorized by a resolution of the board of supervisors, and after all required distributions, a local sheriff or police department, or the district attorney's office, may use funds remaining in the County's DNA Identification Fund, either independently or in combination with remaining funds from another county, "to provide supplemental funding to a qualified local or regional state forensic laboratory for expenditures and administrative costs made or incurred in connection with the processing, analysis, and comparison of DNA crime scene samples and forensic identification samples, and testimony related to that analysis." Codified at Cal. Gov. Code § 76104.6(b)(3)(D)(i);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, ORDERED, APPROVED AND DIRECTED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Santa Barbara that:

1. The Board authorizes, after all required distributions, the Sheriff's Department or District Attorney, may use the funds remaining in the County's DNA Identification Fund, either independently or in combination with remaining funds from another county, "to provide supplemental funding to a qualified local or regional state forensic laboratory for expenditures and administrative costs made or incurred in connection with the processing, analysis, and comparison of DNA crime scene samples and forensic identification samples, and testimony related to that analysis." Cal. Gov. Code § 76104.6(b)(3)(D)(i); and,

2. This Resolution take effect immediately upon its adoption.
