Reacquisition Process

- Reacquisition of Suspended State Water Formally Requested by CCWA (January 7, 2016).
- County Sends Formal Letter to DWR to initiate Process
- County and CCWA to work with DWR on next steps; agreements, contract amendments, CEQA, etc.
- CCWA Allocation CCWA Wide Drought Buffer vs. Agency Allocated Drought Buffer
- Return to Board for further action



History of Suspended Contract Amount

- 1981: Santa Barbara contract amount reduced from 57,700 AF to 45,486 AF
- 1982: DWR agreed to allow Santa Barbara to reacquire the 12,214
 AF
- 2007: DWR grants requests from Santa Barbara.
 - Implementation delayed due to recession
- 2016: Santa Barbara seeks to reactivate water acquisition



Purpose for Requested Reacquisition

- Drought buffer
- Four interested communities:
 - Santa Maria: 10,814 AF, 61% increase
 - Guadalupe: 600 AF, 99% increase
 - Santa Ynez ID#1: 500 AF, 71% increase
 - Solvang: 300 AF, 20% increase



Estimated Costs

- Estimated one-time payments:
 - \$27 million to DWR
 - \$6.2 million to SB County
- Participating agencies will provide their own funding for the past costs.
- Future annual costs: \$150/AF (projected)
- Excellent cost/benefit ratio:
 - 27% increase in water
 - 4% increase in costs



Requested Action

• Submit request to the Department of Water Resources for reacquisition of 12,214 acre-feet.
