Summary Text:

This item is before the Board of Supervisors to receive the Annual Report of the Economic Vitality Team of Santa Barbara County, an initiative of all the chambers of commerce in Santa Barbara County, administered by the Santa Barbara Region Chamber of Commerce.

Background:

The Board of Supervisors approved a one-time allocation of \$150,000 for the Economic Vitality Team (EVT) of Santa Barbara County on June 11, 2014, and a one-time allocation of \$75,000 on June 10, 2015. The requests were made as "outside agency" requests in the FY 2014-15 and FY 2015-16 budget processes, respectively. The first year of funding was intended to provide a one-time, start up grant of \$150,000 to allow the organization to hire a staff person, finalize the creation of the EVT and work with local businesses and foundations to create a stable, long-term funding source for the initiative. The current year grant of \$75,000 was requested to further the program of work, including the completion of

an Economic Development Plan for the County. This Annual Report is a requirement of the contract with the County.

The EVT aims to increase jobs across the region and spur economic development. The mission of the EVT is to enhance the quality of life throughout Santa Barbara County by promoting economic vitality through the generation of jobs, increased capital investment, business retention, expansion and attraction while promoting and supporting entrepreneurs.

During 2015, a cohesive board of directors was formed with representation from each chamber of commerce. The mission statement above was adopted as well as a business plan. Some key activities of the EVT are listed below and in more detail in the included attachments:

- Hired Director of Economic Development
- Convened EVT Board of Directors
- Adopted 2015 Business Plan
- Convened new countywide Economic Development Roundtable
- Convened new countywide Commercial Brokers Advisory Council
- Website for centralized County economic development went live
- Funding Partner program initiated, with agreements from five partners
- First countywide Economic Profile published by EVT
- Tri-county Broadband initiative in development
- Strategic Plan finalized

The EVT will continue to work on the objectives outlined in the statement of work; and facilitate and seek out economic development opportunities.
